1		AN ACT establishing the Government Nonprofit Contracting Advisory

3	Be i	t enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
4		→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 11 IS CREATED TO
5	REA	AD AS FOLLOWS:
6	<u>(1)</u>	The Government Nonprofit Contracting Advisory Commission is hereby
7		established to review and provide periodic reports regarding laws, regulations,
8		and policies that negatively affect nonprofit government contracting. The
9		commission shall be attached to the Commission on Small Business Advocacy for
10		administrative purposes.
11	<u>(2)</u>	The commission shall consist of thirteen (13) members, as follows:
12		(a) Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet or designer, who shall
13		serve as chairperson;
14		(b) Secretary of the Cabinet for Health and Family Services, or designee;
15		(c) Secretary of the Transportation Cabinet, or designee;
16		(d) Secretary of the Education and Workforce Cabinet, or designee;
17		(e) Executive director of the Kentucky Nonprofit Network, or designee; and
18		(f) Eight (8) representatives of 501(c)(3) human services organization,
19		appointed by the Governor from a list of sixteen (16) candidates
20		recommended by the Kentucky Nonprofit Network, who shall serve for a
21		term of four (4) years.
22	<u>(3)</u>	A quorum shall be a majority of the membership of the commission.
23	<u>(4)</u>	Members of the commission shall serve without compensation but shall be
24		reimbursed for necessary and actual travel expenses incurred in the discharge of
25		duties on the commission.
26	<u>(5)</u>	The commission shall meet quarterly and at other times upon the call of the
27		chairperson.

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1		→ SECTION 2. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 11 IS CREATED TO
2	REA	AD AS FOLLOWS:
3	<u>(1)</u>	The duties of the Government Nonprofit Contracting Advisory Commission shall
4		consist of reviewing and offering periodic reports concerning:
5		(a) The feasibility of eliminating redundant or unreasonable laws, regulations,
6		or policies that negatively affect nonprofit government contracting;
7		(b) The effect of state and federal laws and state government policies on
8		contracting with nonprofit agencies;
9		(c) The best practices adopted by other states which facilitate more timely, cost-
10		effective, streamlined, and accountable processes for contracting with
11		nonprofit agencies; and
12		(d) The administrative regulations that may impact nonprofit agencies.
13	<u>(2)</u>	The commission may seek input from other agencies, organizations, or interested
14		parties. In acting as an advocate for nonprofit agencies, the commission may
15		submit a written report to a promulgating administrative body. The report shall
16		be considered as comments received during the public comment period required
17		by KRS 13A.270(1)(c). The report shall specify the commission's findings
18		regarding the administrative regulation, and a copy of the report shall be filed
19		with the regulations complier of the Legislative Research Commission.
20	<u>(3)</u>	By September 1 of each year, the commission shall submit a report to the
21		Governor and to the Legislative Research Commission. The report shall detail its
22		work in the prior fiscal year. The report shall include but not be limited to
23		activities and achievements of the commission, findings of the commission
24		relating to the collection of information and research on public policies and
25		government practices that affect nonprofit agencies, and specific
26		recommendations of ways in which state government could better promote the
27		timely, cost-effective, streamlined, and accountable processes for contracting with

- 2 → Section 3. The General Assembly finds that the work of the Government
- 3 Nonprofit Contracting Task Force demonstrated the complexity of the processes utilized
- 4 by state government to contract with and provide grants to nonprofit agencies, and that
- 5 any improvements to those processes requires a focused and sustained effort that can only
- 6 be provided by an advisory commission.

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
