- 4 WHEREAS, Henry Spalding, born in Marion County, graduated from high school
- 5 and attended Western Kentucky Station College before being called up for military
- 6 service from 1954 to 1956, during which he served overseas; and
- WHEREAS, Henry Spalding was named a manager in the Revenue Cabinet by
- 8 Governor Bert Combs in 1960 and remained in the position under Governor Ned
- 9 Breathitt until 1968; and
- WHEREAS, Henry Spalding built a successful insurance agency in Louisville that
- 11 he started in 1968 and that continues to this day to serve hundreds of families; and
- WHEREAS, in 1977, Henry Spalding was named by Governor Julian Carroll to fill
- a vacancy as the 2nd District Railroad Commissioner for the central part of Kentucky;

- 15 WHEREAS, Henry Spalding was elected Railroad Commissioner in 1979 and re-
- 16 elected in 1983, 1987, 1991, 1995, and 1999; and
- WHEREAS, Henry Spalding, while serving as Railroad Commissioner for over 23
- years, worked to reduce railroad-related fatalities;
- 19 NOW, THEREFORE,
- 20 Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of
- 21 Kentucky:
- → Section 1. The Senate applauds R. Henry Spalding for his years of public
- 23 service to the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
- Section 2. When the Senate adjourns this day, it does so in honor of R. Henry
- 25 Spalding.
