

1 A RESOLUTION adjourning the Senate in honor and loving memory of Donald
2 Wayne Pace.

3 WHEREAS, Donald Wayne Pace was born in Harlan on February 20, 1940, the
4 cherished son of the late Ulysses Grant and Mary Wesley Pace; and

6 of 18 in Harlan County, Mr. Pace would go on to serve as principal and superintendent of
7 several schools and school districts, and was serving as the superintendent of Lewis

16 members, friends, and loved ones who will dearly miss his presence in their lives;
