KRS 273.167 is amended to read as follows: 4 Except as otherwise prohibited by law, corporations may be organized under KRS 5 273.161 to 273.390 for any lawful purpose or purposes, including [,] without being limited $to[\cdot]$ any one (1) or more of the following purposes: charitable; benevolent; eleemosynary; 6 7 educational; civic; patriotic; political; governmental; religious; social; recreational; 8 fraternal; literary; cultural; athletic; scientific; agricultural; horticultural; animal 9 husbandry; and professional, commercial, industrial, or trade association[; but labor 10 unions, cooperative organizations, and organizations subject to any of the provisions of 11 the insurance laws or banking laws of this state may not be organized under KRS 273.161 12 to 273.3901. 13 → Section 2. KRS 273.211 is amended to read as follows: 14 (1) (a) The board of directors shall consist of three (3) or more individuals, with 15 the number specified in or fixed in accordance with the articles of incorporation or bylaws, except as to the number of the first board of 16 17 directors which shall be fixed by the articles of incorporation. 18 (b) The articles of incorporation or bylaws may establish a minimum and 19 maximum number of directors. If a variable range is established, the 20 number of directors may be fixed or changed by the board of directors, 21 within the minimum and maximum, in the manner provided in the articles 22 of incorporation or the bylaws. 23 (c) No decrease in number shall have the effect of shortening the term of any 24 incumbent director[The number of directors of a corporation shall not be less 25 than three (3). Subject to such limitation, the number of directors shall be

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fixed by the bylaws, except as to the number of the first board of directors

which number shall be fixed by the articles of incorporation. The number of

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directors may be increased or decreased from time to time by amendment to
the bylaws, unless the articles of incorporation provide that a change in the
number of directors shall be made only by amendment of the articles of
incorporation. No decrease in number shall have the effect of shortening the
term of any incumbent director. In the absence of a bylaw fixing the number
of directors, the number shall be the same as that stated in the articles of
incorporation].

- (2) The directors constituting the first board of directors shall be named in the articles of incorporation and shall hold office until the first annual election of directors or for such other period as may be specified in the articles of incorporation or the bylaws. Thereafter, directors shall be elected or appointed in the manner and for the terms provided in the articles of incorporation or the bylaws. In the absence of a provision fixing the term of office, the term of office of a director shall be one (1) year, and until his successor is elected and has accepted his election.
- Directors may be divided into classes and the terms of office of the several classes need not be uniform. Each director shall hold office for the term for which he is elected or appointed and until his successor shall have been elected or appointed and qualified.
- 21 (5) Every director of a corporation, by acceptance of election or appointment as a 22 director, including by service, shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction 23 of the courts of the Commonwealth of Kentucky for any action by, in the name of, 24 or on behalf of the corporation.

6		remove, the members of an advisory committee. An advisory committee may not
7		act on behalf of the corporation or bind the corporation to any action but may

18		corporation shall be distributed to its members, directors or officers. A corporation
19		may pay compensation in a reasonable amount to its members, directors, or officers
