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1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION recognizing the suffering and anguish 2 experienced by women and families who learn during pregnancy that their unborn child 3 has a life-limiting condition which could result in the death before or shortly after birth, 4 and the importance of perinatal palliative care and neonatal palliative and hospice care in 5 providing support, information, and education for these women and families.

6 WHEREAS, perinatal palliative care and neonatal palliative and hospice care are 7 innovative and compassionate models of support for parents who choose to continue their 8 pregnancies following a prenatal diagnosis indicating that their unborn child has a life-9 limiting condition and might die before or shortly after birth; and

WHEREAS, through advances in medical testing and diagnostic technology a
growing number of women and families find themselves in this heartbreaking situation
each year; and

WHEREAS, palliative and hospice care providers and comprehensive multidisciplinary care teams have developed wrap-around services including case management, counseling, and individualized birth plans, which provide substantial support to women and families in their special time of need; and

WHEREAS, this specialized support is provided from the time of diagnosis through
the baby's birth and death, thereby helping parents embrace whatever life their baby might
be able to have through assistance in making medical decisions, developing specialized
birth plans, creating memories and keepsakes, and planning memorial services if desired;
and

WHEREAS, the information and support services currently available to grieving expectant parents about perinatal palliative care and neonatal palliative and hospice care are limited and not easily accessible; and

WHEREAS, providers and families must be connected in an efficient and effective
 manner so that citizens of the Commonwealth can utilize the resources available to them;

27 NOW, THEREFORE,

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1 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the 2 *Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Senate concurring therein:*

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 \Rightarrow Section 1. The General Assembly hereby recognizes the extreme pain, suffering, 4 and anguish experienced by women and families who learn during pregnancy that their 5 unborn child has a life-limiting condition which could result in the death of the child 6 before or shortly after birth, or that their child could have a significantly shortened 7 lifespan related to a terminal condition.

8 \rightarrow Section 2. The General Assembly hereby recognizes the importance of 9 connecting grieving women and families with perinatal palliative care and hospice 10 practitioners.

11 → Section 3. The General Assembly hereby urges all hospitals and clinics offering 12 obstetric services, obstetric practices, and alternative birthing centers to provide or make 13 referrals for perinatal palliative care and neonatal palliative and hospice care in the 14 instance of a diagnosis that a pregnancy is incompatible with life or that an unborn child 15 has a life-limiting condition that may result in death shortly after birth or a significantly 16 limited life expectancy.

17 → Section 4. The General Assembly hereby urges palliative and hospice care 18 providers to establish or expand perinatal palliative and neonatal palliative care and 19 hospice programs.

20 → Section 5. The General Assembly hereby urges perinatal palliative and neonatal 21 palliative care and hospice providers to provide anticipatory support and counseling to 22 patients and families before, during, and after delivery through physical, emotional, and 23 spiritual support.

24 → Section 6. The General Assembly hereby urges perinatal palliative and neonatal 25 palliative care and hospice care providers to include coordination of care between the 26 obstetric and neonatal care providers, hospital staff, clinic staff, the patient, and the 27 family of infants with a terminal diagnosis.

Section 7. The General Assembly hereby urges perinatal palliative and neonatal
palliative care and hospice care providers to include assistance with the creation of a
personalized birth plan, designed around the parents' wishes for the labor and delivery
experience and care of their baby at birth, and to assist in the planning of a memorial
service if desired.
