

1           A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging the United States Fish and Wildlife  
2 Service (USFWS) to issue more migratory bird depredation permits and Kentucky Farm  
3 Bureau-administered subpermits to allow Kentucky farmers to legally take black vultures  
4 that are depredating their livestock.

5           WHEREAS, the federal Migratory Bird Treaty Act of 1918, 16 U.S.C. secs. 703 to  
6 712, prohibits pursuing, hunting, taking, capturing, killing, or selling black vultures  
7 without a migratory bird depredation permit or subpermit; and

8           WHEREAS, black vultures are the only vultures found in the Commonwealth that  
9 take live prey, and after range expansion and population increases over the past 50 years,  
10 they have become common in Kentucky; and

11           WHEREAS, there is increasing concern among Kentucky farmers about the  
12 prevalence of livestock depredation caused by black vultures, yet they are prohibited under  
13 federal law from taking them without a migratory bird depredation permit or subpermit;  
14 and

15           WHEREAS, a farmer experiencing black vulture depredation may apply directly to  
16 the USFWS for a migratory bird depredation permit or the farmer may apply for one or  
17 more subpermits that have been allotted by the USFWS to Kentucky Farm Bureau for  
18 distribution; and

19           WHEREAS, many farmers have not been able to adequately protect their livestock  
20 from black vulture depredation, because they have found the migratory bird depredation  
21 permit and subpermit application and distribution process to be long, onerous, and overly  
22 restrictive; and

23           WHEREAS, Kentucky farmers believe that they have the right to protect their  
24 livestock from black vultures, which have become nuisances to the agricultural community  
25 in the Commonwealth;

26           NOW, THEREFORE,

27           *Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the*

1 *Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Senate concurring therein:*

2       ➔Section 1. The Kentucky General Assembly urges the USFWS to issue more  
3 permits and subpermits to allow for the taking of depredating black vultures and to  
4 shorten and streamline the application process to allow greater and more timely relief to  
5 farmers experiencing depredation.

6       ➔Section 2. The Clerk of the House of Representatives shall send a copy of this  
7 Resolution and notification of its adoption to each member of the Kentucky Congressional  
8 delegation, Greg Sheehan, acting director of the USFWS, and Mark Haney, president of  
9 Kentucky Farm Bureau.
