

1 A JOINT RESOLUTION designating a portion of Kentucky Route 10 in Greenup
2 County in honor and memory of Spencer T. Carter.

3 WHEREAS, Spencer T. Carter enlisted in the United States Army on March 15,
4 1917, and was honorably discharged on November 3, 1919; and

5 WHEREAS, Spencer T. Carter enlisted the second time in the United States Army
6 on November 4, 1919; and

7 WHEREAS, Spencer T. Carter's wartime action included participation in the Aisne-
8 Marne Offensive, the Saizerais Sector, the St. Mihiel Offensive, and the Meuse-Argonne
9 Offensive; and

10 WHEREAS, Spencer T. Carter served his country bravely during WWI and was
11 awarded the Silver Star for his gallantry in action from July 18, 1918, through July 22,
12 1918; and

13 WHEREAS, Spencer T. Carter was awarded the WWI victory medal with battle
14 clasp for his participation in the Aisne-Marne Offensive from July 18, 1918, through
15 August 6, 1918, and

16 WHEREAS, Spencer T. Carter was treated for numerous war wounds from mustard
17 gas, sustained as a result of hostile action on October 2, 1918, and for his sacrifice was
18 awarded the Purple Heart; and

19 WHEREAS, Spencer T. Carter was honorably discharged from the United States
20 Army on November 3, 1922; and

21 WHEREAS, the General Assembly sees fit to honor the bravery of Spencer T.
22 Carter by designating a roadway in his honor and memory;

23 NOW, THEREFORE,

24 ***Be it resolved by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:***

25 ➔Section 1. The Transportation Cabinet is hereby directed to designate Kentucky
26 Route 10 in Greenup County, from mile point 1.897 to mile point 3.554, as the "WWI
27 Veteran Spencer T. Carter Memorial Highway," and shall, within 30 days of the effective

- 1 date of this Resolution, erect the appropriate signage.
