1	A RESOLUTION declaring pornography to be a public health crisis, encouraging

6	children by treating them as objects; and
7	WHEREAS, pornography increases the demand for sex trafficking, prostitution, and
8	child sexual abuse images/child pornography; and
9	WHEREAS, pornography use puts people at increased risk of committing sexual
10	offenses; and
11	WHEREAS, advances in technology have resulted in children and youth being
12	exposed to and actively seeking what used to be referred to as hardcore (now mainstream)
13	pornography at an alarming rate, leading to low self-esteem and eating disorders, an
14	increase in problematic sexual activity at younger ages, and an increased desire to engage
15	in risky sexual behavior as young adolescents; and
16	WHEREAS, pornography has potential detrimental effects on the user such as
17	emotional, mental, and medical illnesses; and
18	WHEREAS, pornography has potential addictive effects and can lead to increasing
19	themes of risky sexual behaviors, extreme degradation, violence, and child sexual abuse
20	images/child pornography; and
21	WHEREAS, pornography use has a detrimental effect on the health of the family as
22	it is linked to lessening desire in young men to marry, dissatisfaction in marriage, and
23	infidelity; and
24	WHEREAS, the Kentucky General Assembly desires that women and children are
25	viewed and treated with dignity; and
26	WHEREAS, obscenity is pervasive despite being degrading, harmful, and
27	unprotected speech; and

- Section 2. This honorable body recognizes the public health crisis created by pornography.

This honorable body acknowledges the need for education about the harmful effects of pornography use for the individual and society and the need for prevention, research, and policy change at the community and societal level in order to address the epidemic that is harming the people of our state and our country as a whole.
- Section 4. This honorable body respectfully requests the Kentucky Attorney
 General and Commonwealth's Attorney Offices to treat the prosecution of obscenity and
 other sexual exploitation offenses with high priority and to seek adequate penalties to
 dissuade such offenses.
- Section 5. This honorable body commends the Kentucky State Police for fighting Internet crimes against children and in the lifesaving work done by its troopers, officers, and civilians in rescuing children from exploitation and trafficking and respectfully requests all law enforcement within the Commonwealth to enforce current obscenity and other sexual exploitation laws.
