1	A RESOLUTION recognizing the importance of becoming an age-friendly
2	Kentucky.
3	WHEREAS, the shift in demographics towards an aging population taking place
4	worldwide is having a profound effect on the quality of life of individuals, families, and
5	communities; and
6	WHEREAS, the World Health Organization, the International Federation of Aging,
7	AARP, and various nations, states, and local municipalities have made efforts to prepare
8	communities for the impact of aging and the benefits of becoming age-friendly
9	communities; and
10	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Kentucky currently ranks sixth nationally in
11	percentage of aging population; and
12	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Kentucky recognizes the financial, emotional,
13	and collective toll this is taking on Kentucky families and communities; and
14	WHEREAS, there is a growing need for assistance as we age, and the valuable role
15	elders have played, and continue to play, as family caregivers, primary providers for their
16	grandchildren, and local volunteers; and
17	WHEREAS, 41.5 percent of Kentucky households are composed of
18	multigenerational families with grandparents raising their grandchildren; and
19	WHEREAS, 92 percent of older adult caregivers are not receiving social security
20	and 85 percent do not receive any type of monetary assistance or support; and
21	WHEREAS, 45 percent of caregivers reported having more health disparities than
22	non-caregivers; and
23	WHEREAS, the need for caregiving is proportionally higher in rural areas due to
24	the out-migration of younger individuals;
25	NOW, THEREFORE,
26	Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
27	Commonwealth of Kentucky:

2	imp	ortance of working towards becoming an age-friendly Kentucky by:
3	(1)	Promoting policies that make Kentucky cities and towns friendlier to the aging
4		population, a focus which can benefit other demographics in the state;
5	(2)	Encouraging cities and towns to take part in the age-friendly movement;
6	(3)	Honoring the right of every individual to be treated with dignity and respect
7		regardless of age, ability, station, or income; and
8	(4)	Protecting the safety and well-being of older people to live out their lives without
9		having to make a choice between food or medication, or fear of becoming isolated
10		or alone.
