

1 A RESOLUTION adjourning the House of Representatives in honor and loving
2 memory of Mavis F. Broome.

3 WHEREAS, Mavis F. Broome was born on June 8, 1933, to the late Charlie and
4 Cordelia Farmer; and

5 WHEREAS, Mavis F. Broome graduated from Bunker Hill High School, Pearl
6 River Junior College, Mississippi College, and Eastern Kentucky University, and earned
7 additional credits from Tulane University and Cumberland College; and

8 WHEREAS, Mavis F. Broome began her education career by teaching in New
9 Orleans, Louisiana, for seven years and thereafter teaching in McCreary County for 27
10 years. She also taught undergraduate courses in special education at Cumberland College
11 for nearly a decade; and

12 WHEREAS, Mavis F. Broome was a devout member of 50 years of First Baptist
13 Church of Williamsburg, where she served as chair of the daycare committee and head of
14 the food pantry committee. She was a proud member of the same Sunday School class for
15 over 50 years; and

16 WHEREAS, on August 6, 2017, Mavis F. Broome was called to be with her Lord.
17 In addition to her parents, she was preceded in passing by three sisters, Katie Farmer,
18 Elmira Cooper, and Roslie Bass; and a brother, Colbert Farmer; and

19 WHEREAS, Mavis F. Broome is survived by her husband, John Broome; her
20 daughters, Kim White and her husband, Fred, Erica Harris and her husband, John, and
21 Shelleigh Moses and her husband, Ronnie; her grandchildren, Erin White Wells and her
22 husband, Phillip, Katelyn Harris, Haley Harris, Amanda Moses, Tyler Harris and his wife,
23 Hannah, Kelsey White, and Richie Moses; her sister-in-law, Sarah Broome White; her
24 sister, Ester Laird and her husband, Grover; and a host of nieces, nephews, friends, and
