2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 26A IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) As used in this section, "veterans treatment court program" means any court
6	overseen by the Department of Specialty Courts within the Administrative Office
7	of the Courts which supervises substance use or mental health treatment for
, 8	current or former members of the active military, military reserves, or National
9	Guard, including state active duty.
10	(2) The Supreme Court of Kentucky shall administer the veterans treatment court
10	program to:
12	(a) Develop standards, establish program eligibility, and provide oversight;

14	(c) Collect, report, and disseminate data;
15	(d) Sponsor and coordinate training; and
16	(e) Apply for, administer, and evaluate any grant for veterans treatment court
17	purposes.
18	(3) Nothing contained in this section shall confer a right or an expectation of a right
19	to treatment for an offender within the criminal justice system who is a current
20	<u>or former member of the military.</u>
21	(4) If a defendant has been accepted into the veterans treatment court program and
22	is supervised by that program as a condition of probation, the defendant shall not
23	be subject to the supervision of the Division of Probation and Parole during his
24	or her participation in the court program.

26	Whenever a statute mentions probation, shock probation, conditional discharge, home
27	incarceration, or other form of alternative to incarceration, that alternative may include
