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AN ACT relating to sexual violence training.

2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

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→ Section 1. KRS 311.601 is amended to read as follows:

4 (1)The board may adopt reasonable rules and regulations to effectuate and implement 5 the provisions of KRS 311.550 to 311.620, including but not limited to regulations 6 designed to ensure the continuing professional competency of present and future 7 licensees. As an adjunct to the power conferred upon the board by this section, the board may require licensees to submit to interrogation as to the nature and extent of 8 9 their postgraduate medical education and to require licensees found to be deficient 10 in their efforts to keep abreast of new methods and technology, to obtain additional 11 instruction and training therein.

12 (2) As part of the continuing medical education which the board adopts to ensure 13 continuing professional competency of present and future licensees, the board shall 14 ensure that:

(a) Current practicing pediatricians, including those certified in medicine and
pediatrics, radiologists, family practitioners, and those physicians practicing in
an emergency medicine or urgent care setting, demonstrate completion of a
one (1) time course of at least one (1) hour of continuing medical education
approved by the board and covering the recognition and prevention of
pediatric abusive head trauma, as defined in KRS 620.020, prior to December
31, 2017; and

22 (b) Future practicing pediatricians, including those certified in medicine and 23 pediatrics, radiologists, family practitioners, and those physicians who will 24 practice in an emergency medicine or urgent care setting, demonstrate 25 completion of a one (1) time course of at least one (1) hour of continuing 26 medical education, or its equivalent, approved by the board and covering the 27 recognition and prevention of pediatric abusive head trauma, as defined in

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1		KRS 620.020, within five (5) years of licensure.
2	<u>(3)</u>	As a part of the continuing education requirements which the board adopts to
3		ensure continuing competency of present and future licensees, the board shall
4		ensure that licensees demonstrate completion of a one-time training course of at
5		least three (3) hours covering awareness of sexual violence, including the
6		prevalence of sexual violence in Kentucky, legal requirements, model protocols
7		for emergency facilities, and community resources, within five (5) years of
8		<u>licensure</u> .
9		→ Section 2. KRS 311.844 is amended to read as follows:
10	(1)	To be licensed by the board as a physician assistant, an applicant shall:
11		(a) Submit a completed application form with the required fee;
12		(b) Be of good character and reputation;
13		(c) Be a graduate of an approved program; and
14		(d) Have passed an examination approved by the board within three (3) attempts.
15	(2)	A physician assistant who is authorized to practice in another state and who is in
16		good standing may apply for licensure by endorsement from the state of his or her
17		credentialing if that state has standards substantially equivalent to those of this
18		Commonwealth.
19	(3)	A physician assistant's license shall be renewed upon fulfillment of the following
20		requirements:
21		(a) The holder shall be of good character and reputation;
22		(b) The holder shall provide evidence of completion during the previous two (2)
23		years of a minimum of one hundred (100) hours of continuing education
24		approved by the American Medical Association, the American Osteopathic
25		Association, the American Academy of Family Physicians, the American
26		Academy of Physician Assistants, or by another entity approved by the board;
27		(c) The holder shall provide evidence of completion of a continuing education

- 3 (d) As a part of the continuing education requirements that the board adopts to 4 ensure continuing competency of present and future licensees the board shall ensure that physician's assistants shall demonstrate completion of a one-time 5 6 training course of one and one-half (1.5) hours of training covering the 7 prevention and recognition of pediatric abusive head trauma, as defined in 8 KRS 620.020. The one and one-half (1.5) hours of continuing education 9 required under this section shall be included in the current number of required 10 continuing education hours; [and]
- 11(e) As a part of the continuing education requirements which the board adopts12to ensure continuing competency of present and future licensees, the board13shall ensure that physician's assistants demonstrate completion of a one-
- 14 *time training course of at least three (3) hours covering awareness of sexual*
- *violence, including the prevalence of sexual violence in Kentucky, legal requirements, model protocols for emergency facilities, and community*
- 17 resources. The three (3) hours of continuing education required under this
- 18
 paragraph shall be included in the current number of required continuing
- 19 <u>education hours; and</u>
- 20 (f) The holder shall provide proof of current certification with the National
 21 Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants.
- 22 → Section 3. KRS 311A.120 is amended to read as follows:
- (1) As a condition of being issued a certificate or license as an emergency medical
 technician or first responder, the applicant shall have completed a Kentucky Board
 of Emergency Medical Services approved educational course on the transmission,
 control, treatment, and prevention of the human immunodeficiency virus and
 acquired immunodeficiency syndrome with an emphasis on appropriate behavior

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1 and attitude change.

2	(2)	The board shall require continuing education for emergency medical technicians or
3		first responders that includes the completion of one and one-half (1.5) hours of
4		board approved continuing education covering the recognition and prevention of
5		pediatric abusive head trauma, as defined in KRS 620.020, at least one (1) time
6		every five (5) years. The one and one-half (1.5) hours required under this section
7		shall be included in the current number of required continuing education hours.

- 8 (3) The board shall require continuing education for emergency medical technicians
- 9 or first responders which includes the completion of a one-time training course of
- 10 at least three (3) hours covering awareness of sexual violence, including
- 11 reporting options, care options, pre-hospital treatment considerations, knowledge
- 12 of regional rape crisis centers, and how to access the SANE-ready list, at least
- 13one (1) time every five (5) years. The three (3) hours of continuing education14required under this subsection shall be included in the current number of
- 15 *required continuing education hours*.

16 → Section 4. KRS 314.073 is amended to read as follows:

17 (1) As a prerequisite for license renewal, all individuals licensed under provisions of
18 this chapter shall be required to document continuing competency during the
19 immediate past licensure period as prescribed in regulations promulgated by the
20 board.

- (2) The continuing competency requirement shall be documented and reported as set
 forth by the board in administrative regulations promulgated in accordance with
 KRS Chapter 13A.
- (3) The board shall approve providers of continuing education. The approval may
 include recognition of providers approved by national organizations and state
 boards of nursing with comparable standards. Standards for these approvals shall be
 set by the board in administrative regulations promulgated in accordance with the

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1 provisions of KRS Chapter 13A.

2 (4) The board shall work cooperatively with professional nursing organizations,
3 approved nursing schools, and other potential sources of continuing education
4 programs to ensure that adequate continuing education offerings are available
5 statewide. The board may enter into contractual agreements to implement the
6 provisions of this section.

7 (5) The board shall be responsible for notifying applicants for licensure and licensees
8 applying for license renewal, of continuing competency requirements.

9 (6) As a part of the continuing education requirements that the board adopts to ensure 10 continuing competency of present and future licensees, the board shall ensure 11 practitioners licensed under KRS Chapter 314 complete a one-time training course 12 of at least one and one-half (1.5) hours covering the recognition and prevention of 13 pediatric abusive head trauma, as defined in KRS 620.020. The one and one-half 14 (1.5) hours required under this section shall be included in the current number of 15 required continuing education hours.

16 (7) In order to offset administrative costs incurred in the implementation of the
17 mandatory continuing competency requirements, the board may charge reasonable
18 fees as established by regulation in accordance with the provisions of KRS Chapter
19 13A.

20 (8) The continuing competency requirements shall include at least five (5) contact
 21 hours in pharmacology continuing education for any person licensed as an advanced
 22 practice registered nurse.

(9) As a part of the continuing education requirements which the board adopts to ensure continuing competency of present and future licensees, the board shall ensure practitioners licensed under KRS Chapter 314 complete a one-time training course of at least three (3) hours covering awareness of sexual violence,
