2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:			
3		→Section 1. KRS 520.095 is amended to read as follows:		
4	(1)	A person is guilty of fleeing or evading police in the first degree:		
5		(a) When, while operating a motor vehicle with intent to elude or flee, the person		
6		knowingly or wantonly disobeys a direction to stop his or her motor vehicle,		
7		given by a person recognized to be a police officer, and at least one (1) of the		
8		following conditions exists:		
9		1. The person is fleeing immediately after committing an act of domestic		
10		violence as defined in KRS 403.720;		
11		2. The person is driving under the influence of alcohol or any other		
12		substance or combination of substances in violation of KRS 189A.010;		
13		3. The person is driving while his or her driver's license is suspended for		
14		violating KRS 189A.010; or		
15		4. By fleeing or eluding, the person is the cause, or creates substantial risk,		
16		of serious physical injury or death to any person or property; or		
17		(b) When, as a pedestrian, and with intent to elude or flee, the person knowingly		
18		or wantonly disobeys an order to stop, given by a person recognized to be a		
19		peace officer, and at least one (1) of the following conditions exists:		
20		1. The person is fleeing immediately after committing an act of domestic		
21		violence as defined in KRS 403.720; or		
22		2. By fleeing or eluding, the person is the cause of, or creates a substantial		
23		risk of, serious physical injury or death to any person or property.		
24	(2)	Fleeing or evading police in the first degree is a Class D felony, except that fleeing		
25		or evading police in the first degree is a Class C felony when the person flees or		
26		evades the police under subsection (1)(a) of this section and operates a motor

1	<u>(a)</u>	Through an active school zone;
2	<u>(b)</u>	At speeds of thirty (30) miles per hour or more over the speed limit in a
3		residential area; or
4	<u>(c)</u>	In a way that results in a collision with another vehicle, regardless of any
5		injury to any person involved in the collision.
