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1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging Congress and the President of the United
2	States to enact a long-term reauthorization of the Children's Health Insurance Program.
3	WHEREAS, the Children's Health Insurance Program, also known as CHIP, is a
4	state-federal partnership that provides a critical pathway for families with modest means
5	to obtain health care coverage for their children; and
6	WHEREAS, CHIP provides health coverage to children whose families earn too
7	much for them to qualify for Medicaid and cannot obtain affordable family coverage
8	through their employer or the Federal Health Insurance Marketplace; and
9	WHEREAS, federal CHIP funds, in combination with matching state funds, help
10	provide coverage to nearly nine million children in the United States, including over
11	92,000 children in the Commonwealth; and
12	WHEREAS, the CHIP program has helped to reduce the national uninsured rate
13	among children to five percent, well below the nearly 11 percent uninsured rate among
14	nonelderly adults; and
15	WHEREAS, in 1997, Congress first created the State Children's Health Insurance
16	Program, the precursor to CHIP, with bipartisan support, and the program has continued
17	to enjoy broad support from the public and elected officials from all states and major
18	political parties; and
19	WHEREAS, the most recent reauthorization of CHIP, in 2015, extended the
20	program for only two years, and Congress allowed it to expire on September 30, 2017;
21	and
22	WHEREAS, since the expiration of the federal program's authority, Kentucky has
23	lost its annual allotment of almost \$268 million, and like other states is maintaining its
24	program with unspent allotments, which are insufficient to operate the program for more
25	than a few months; and
26	WHEREAS, Kentucky expects its unspent funding to last through February 2018,
27	while many other states are anticipating that their funding will be expended even more

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- WHEREAS, states cannot easily adapt to irregular federal funding streams, as they
- 3 need time to plan programs and budgets, notify families and other stakeholders, make
- 4 changes to eligibility systems, and train eligibility workers; and
- 5 WHEREAS, a complete expiration of CHIP would also impose new financial costs
- 6 on states, which are required by federal law to continue certain children's Medicaid
- 7 coverage that is supported with CHIP funds, even if those CHIP funds cease to be
- 8 provided by the federal government; and
- 9 WHEREAS, there is legislation currently under consideration in both houses of
- 10 Congress to reauthorize CHIP for an additional five years, but differences in the two
- versions of the legislation and other political disagreements make enactment of such
- legislation uncertain; and
- WHEREAS, it is therefore fitting and proper, and in the interests of the residents of
- 14 Kentucky, for the Kentucky General Assembly to respectfully urge the United States
- 15 Congress and the President of the United States to enact a long-term reauthorization of
- the Children's Health Insurance Program;
- 17 NOW, THEREFORE,
- 18 Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of
- 19 Kentucky, the House of Representatives concurring therein:
- 20 → Section 1. The General Assembly respectfully urges the United States Congress
- 21 and the President of the United States to enact a long-term reauthorization of the
- 22 Children's Health Insurance Program.
- → Section 2. The Clerk of the House of Representatives shall transmit a copy of
- 24 this Resolution to the President of the United States, the Speaker of the United States
- 25 House of Representatives, the Minority Leader of the United States House of
- 26 Representatives, the Majority Leader of the United States Senate, the Minority Leader of
- 27 the United States Senate, and each member of Kentucky's delegation to the United States
