- A RESOLUTION honoring and congratulating the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks upon the 150th anniversary of their order and recognizing the Kentucky Elks
- 3 Association upon the occasion of their 2018 State Convention in Frankfort.

WHEREAS, founded in New York City on February 16, 1867, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks has spread across the country, with the history of the Elks in Kentucky beginning in 1877, when 12 gentlemen established Louisville Lodge #8, continuing with the first state convention in 1902, to today, when almost 6,000 members at 16 lodges all across the Commonwealth espouse the Elks' cardinal principles of charity, justice, brotherly love, and fidelity; and

WHEREAS, dedicated to those virtues, the Elks invest millions of hours each year to build stronger communities, assist homeless veterans, and ensure that kids steer away from drugs. To that end, Elks have disbursed, over the course of the Order's history, more than \$3.6 billion in cash, goods, and services to the nation's veterans, youth, the disadvantaged and handicapped, and patriotic and civic programs; and

WHEREAS, the philanthropic efforts of Kentucky's Elk Lodges and the Kentucky Elks Association are impressive as well, with the 2016-17 lodge year witnessing almost 6,500 Elks and their helpers serving over 100.000 program participants, and donating over 25,000 volunteer hours and almost \$1.4 million in total value of contributions; and

WHEREAS, the programs of the Kentucky Elks have a special emphasis on children. From giving every 3rd grade student in the lodge area a dictionary, to spreading the Elks' drug awareness message, to conducting annual Hoop Shoot and Soccer Shoot programs to foster healthy competition, to providing sponsorships of scouting programs and schools, to providing hundreds of thousands of dollars in scholarship money to college bound students, the Elks have made supporting and fostering the next generation of leaders their organization's calling card; and

WHEREAS, this dedication to children is perhaps best exemplified through the Kentucky Elks major project, providing funding for two summer camps that serve

medically fragile children, allowing these innocent ones, who have had to grow up too
 quickly, the opportunity the be children again, if only for too brief a time; and

WHEREAS, embedded in the fabric of America, the Elks are steadfast in their commitment to honoring and serving our nation's military members and veterans. The Kentucky Elks fulfill this promise daily in visiting and providing social events and friendship to veterans in Veteran Affairs medical facilities, hospitals, and nursing homes and donating much needed supplies and equipment to these facilities to ensure the veterans receive the care they deserve; and

9 WHEREAS, it is indeed fitting and proper that an organization of such high 10 purpose and good deeds, honestly and selflessly performed, receive public recognition 11 and commendation.
