2 Brown.

3 WHEREAS, Gordon Brown was born in Clarksburg on September 15, 1924, the
4 cherished son of the late Randolph and Minnie Gulley Brown; and

5 WHEREAS, Gordon Brown was a proud veteran of the United States Army who
6 served in World War II with the 10th Mountain Division. The host of *Colonel Brown's*
7 *Classic Country* program on WKKS radio, he was a retired educator who had worked in
8 the Lewis County School System as a vocational auto body instructor; and

9 WHEREAS, Gordon Brown was a lifelong musician, an avid writer who penned
10 "The Colonel's Corner" for *The Lewis County Herald*, and a member of the Monte Lewis
11 Stamm VFW Post 5438 and the Clarksburg Church of Christ; and

12 WHEREAS, Gordon Brown departed this earthly life and entered into the kingdom
13 of Heaven on March 10, 2018, leaving his family, friends, and all those whose lives he
14 touched in solemn mourning; and

15 WHEREAS, Gordon Brown was preceded in death by his parents; son, Allen
16 Brown; a child at birth; and six siblings. He is survived by his wife of 72 years, Dorothy
17 "Dot" Brown; daughter, Dottie Logan; sons, Randy Brown and his wife, Ellie, and Dennis
18 Brown and his wife, Tammy; grandchildren, Brent Logan, Ashley (Joe) Dillow, Lindsey
19 Brown, Kaitlin Brown, and Ben Brown; four great-grandchildren; and a host of other
20 family members, friends, and loved ones who will dearly miss his presence in their lives;
