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AN ACT relating to submission of budget unit requests.

2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

3 \rightarrow Section 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Tourism, Arts and Heritage 4 Cabinet, Department of Parks, additional General Fund moneys in the amount of 5 \$2,121,000 in fiscal year 2019-2020 for new debt service to support new bonds for Phase 6 I of Revitalization and Improvements of Kentucky State Parks capital projects as set forth 7 in this section. There is hereby authorized and appropriated \$20,100,000 in Bond Funds 8 in fiscal year 2019-2020 for the Waste Water Treatment and Infrastructure Upgrades 9 Pool. There is hereby authorized and appropriated \$11,600,000 in Bond Funds in fiscal 10 year 2019-2020 for the Lodge Roof Replacements and Repairs Pool. There is hereby 11 authorized and appropriated \$10,800,000 in Bond Funds in fiscal year 2019-2020 for the 12 Utilities and Communications Cabling Infrastructure Replacement Pool. There is hereby 13 authorized and appropriated \$4,100,000 in Bond Funds in fiscal year 2019-2020 for the 14 Life Safety System Upgrade and ADA Improvements Pool. There is hereby authorized 15 and appropriated \$3,400,000 in Bond Funds in fiscal year 2019-2020 for the Hospitality 16 Upgrades Pool.

Section 2. It is the intent of the 2019 General Assembly to appropriate to the
Tourism, Arts and Heritage Cabinet, Department of Parks, an additional \$50,000,000 in
Bond Funds in each fiscal year of the 2020-2022 biennium for Phases II and III of
Revitalization and Improvements of Kentucky State Parks capital projects.

- Section 3. There is hereby appropriated to the Economic Development Cabinet
 additional General Fund moneys in the amount of \$1,060,500 in fiscal year 2019-2020 for
 new debt service to support new bonds for the Economic Development Bond Program 2020 capital project as set forth in this section. There is hereby authorized and
 appropriated \$25,000,000 in Bond Funds in fiscal year 2019-2020 for the Economic
 Development Bond Program 2020.
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→ Section 4. 2018 Kentucky Acts Chapter 203, Section 1, (1) Tourism Grants, at

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page 1729, is amended to read as follows:

2 **Tourism Grants:** Included in the above Restricted Funds appropriation is (1) 3 \$350,000 in each fiscal year to support the Local *Tourism*[Theater] Grant Program. The 4 Kentucky Department of Tourism shall develop and administer the Local 5 *Tourism*[Theater] Grant Program for the purpose of supporting local theater programs and museums which complement the statewide tourism marketing efforts. The 6 7 department shall set [program]guidelines, timelines, funding cycles, reporting 8 requirements, reimbursement procedures, and all other logistics and programmatic details 9 necessary to manage and effectuate the grant program. The Local *Tourism*[Theater] 10 Grant Program shall be open to all eligible local theater programs and museums in 11 Kentucky, and the department shall provide grant program information on the 12 department's industry Web site page and send notifications for applying for funding 13 through the local tourism offices or the designated tourism representative from each 14 county and/or city which is named and submitted to the Kentucky Department of Tourism 15 by the applicable county judge/executive or mayor. Any funds that are not fully expended 16 through the corresponding annual grant cycle by approved recipients shall lapse to the 17 credit of the Tourism, Meeting, and Convention Marketing Fund.

18 Notwithstanding any other provision of KRS 61.565, 61.702, 2018 \rightarrow Section 5. 19 Ky. Acts ch. 169, Pt. IV, 5., and 2018 Ky. Acts ch. 203 to the contrary, the employer 20 contribution rate from July 1, 2019, through June 30, 2020, shall be 49.47 percent, 21 consisting of 41.06 percent for pension and 8.41 percent for health insurance for 22 nonhazardous duty employees participating in the Kentucky Employees Retirement 23 System who are employed by Mental Health/Mental Retardation Boards, Local and 24 District Health Departments, domestic violence shelters, rape crisis centers, child 25 advocacy centers, state supported universities and community colleges, and any other 26 agency eligible to voluntarily cease participating in the Kentucky Employees Retirement 27 System pursuant to KRS 61.522.

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1 → Section 6. There is hereby appropriated to Kentucky State University additional 2 General Fund moneys in the amount of \$290,000 in fiscal year 2018-2019 to fund the state match payments required of land-grant universities under federal law. 3

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 \rightarrow Section 7. Notwithstanding KRS 45.777 and 164A.575(8), Kentucky State 5 University may dispose of real property and improvements that will become surplus to its 6 needs and retain the proceeds from any sale.

7 \rightarrow Section 8. There is hereby appropriated to the Kentucky Community and 8 Technical College System additional General Fund moneys in the amount of \$4,000,000 9 in fiscal year 2019-2020 which shall be directed to Somerset Community College for 10 expansion of the workforce and economic development program. Any portion of the 11 \$4,000,000 not directed to Somerset Community College for the expansion of the 12 workforce and economic development program shall lapse to the General Fund at the end 13 of fiscal year 2019-2020.

14 → Section 9. There is hereby appropriated to the University of Kentucky additional 15 General Fund moneys in the amount of \$5,000,000 in fiscal year 2019-2020 for the 16 advanced manufacturing initiative.

17 → Section 10. There is hereby appropriated to the University of Kentucky additional General Fund moneys in the amount of \$8,000,000 in fiscal year 2019-2020 for 18 19 a building renovation capital project for an aging and dementia research facility.

20 There is hereby appropriated to the University of Louisville \rightarrow Section 11. 21 additional General Fund moneys in the amount of \$5,000,000 in fiscal year 2019-2020 for 22 the Multidisciplinary Institute for Robotics and Advanced Manufacturing.

23 \rightarrow Section 12. Whereas the provisions of this Act provide ongoing support for 24 programs funded in the 2018-2020 executive branch biennial budget, an emergency is 25 declared to exist, and this Act takes effect upon its passage and approval by the Governor 26 or upon its otherwise becoming law.
