3		→ Section 1. KRS 217.215 is amended to read as follows:
4	(1)	The[State] Board of Pharmacy, its agents and inspectors shall have the same
5		powers of inspection and enforcement as the cabinet under KRS 217.005 to
6		217.215, insofar as it relates to drugs in licensed pharmacies.
7	(2)	The Board of Pharmacy may establish regulations relating to the storage and
8		retrieval of prescription records in licensed pharmacies, including regulations
9		regarding computerized recordkeeping systems.
10	(3)	(a) No prescription for any drug may be refilled by a pharmacist unless authorized
11		by the prescribing practitioner, except that in emergency situations in which
12		such authorization may not be readily or easily obtained from the
13		practitioner[the board of pharmacy may promulgate rules and regulations to
14		permit] a pharmacist may[to]:
15		$\underline{I.\{(a)\}}$ Dispense up to a seventy-two (72) hour supply of maintenance
16		medication[in emergency situations in which such authorization may
17		not be readily or easily obtained from the practitioner]; [and]
18		2. Dispense greater than a seventy-two (72) hour supply of maintenance
19		medication if:
20		a. The standard unit of dispensing for the drug exceeds a seventy-
21		two (72) hour supply;
22		b. The pharmacist dispenses a supply of the drug that is equal to
23		the standard unit of dispensing for the drug; and
24		c. The drug is used for insulin therapy or the treatment of chronic
25		respiratory diseases; and
26		$\underline{3.[(b)]}$ Dispense up to a thirty (30) day supply of maintenance medication
27		in emergency situations as authorized by KRS 315.500.

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1	(\underline{b}) [Such] Emergency refills <u>dispensed under this subsection</u> shall not be
2	authorized for any controlled substance or for any drug which is not essential
3	to maintenance of life or continuation of therapy in chronic disease conditions.
4	(c) The Board of Pharmacy shall promulgate administrative regulations to
5	carry out the provisions of this subsection.

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
