A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging Facebook, YouTube, eBay, and Amazon
 to re-examine their policies relating to the marketing efforts of industrial hemp
 businesses.

WHEREAS, industrial hemp is defined as the plant Cannabis sativa L. and any part
of such plant, whether growing or not, with a delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol concentration
of not more than 0.3 percent on a dry weight basis; and

WHEREAS, since 2014, Kentucky has conducted an industrial hemp research pilot
program that is widely regarded as a model for other states to emulate; and

9 WHEREAS, in 2018, Kentucky farmers planted approximately 6,700 acres of 10 industrial hemp, with even more interest in hemp production anticipated in 2019; and

WHEREAS, industrial hemp processors in Kentucky and other states have proven
that industrial hemp is an economically viable agricultural commodity that can be used to
make a variety of products; and

WHEREAS, on December 20, 2018, President Donald Trump signed into law the
Agricultural Improvement Act of 2018, also known as the federal farm bill, thereby
removing industrial hemp from the list of controlled substances under federal law; and

WHEREAS, although the production and marketing of industrial hemp and hempbased products are legal, Facebook, YouTube, eBay, and Amazon have attempted to interfere with industrial hemp business owners and their efforts to advertise and communicate with the public about their products; and

WHEREAS, multiple industrial hemp business owners across the Commonwealth
 encountered an unnecessary obstruction in marketing efforts when their key marketing
 platforms, such as Facebook, unpublished their web pages; and

WHEREAS, limiting users' ability to advertise and communicate about hemp-based products is harmful to the users of Facebook, YouTube, eBay, and Amazon and is entirely unnecessary in light of recent developments in Washington and state capitals across the United States;

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1 NOW, THEREFORE,

2 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the 3 Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Senate concurring therein:

Section 1. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky urges
Facebook, YouTube, eBay, and Amazon to quickly re-examine their policies relating to
industrial hemp businesses and their marketing efforts and to ensure that businesses
offering hemp-based products are given the opportunity to advertise and communicate
with the public.
