Amend printed copy of **SB 150/GA**

On page 1, delete lines 5 to 10 in their entirety and insert the following:

"(1) Kentucky residents who are aged twenty-one (21) or older, and otherwise able to lawfully possess a firearm, may carry concealed firearms or other concealed deadly weapons without a license in the same locations as persons with valid licenses issued under KRS 237.110 if the person:

(a) Demonstrates competence with a firearm by successful completion of a firearms safety or training course that is conducted by a firearms instructor who is certified by a national organization with membership open to residents of any state or territory of the United States, which was created to promote firearms education, safety, and the profession of firearms use and training, and to foster professional behavior in its members. The organization shall require members to adhere to its own code of ethics and conduct a program which certifies firearms instructors and includes the use of written tests, in person instruction, and a component of live-fire training. These national organizations shall include but are not limited to the National Rifle Association, the United States Concealed Carry Association, and the National Shooting Sports Foundation. The training requirement may also be fulfilled through any firearms safety course offered or approved by the Department of Criminal Justice Training;

- (b) Receives documentation of the completed course required by this section from the trainer leading the course; and
- (c) Carries documentation of the completed course required by this section whenever the person carries a concealed weapon in the Commonwealth.
- (2) (a) No unit of state or local government shall require a person to pay any fee to any government entity in order to lawfully carry concealed weapons under this section; and
- (b) No unit of state or local government shall collect data or maintain any database regarding the lawful carrying of concealed weapons under this section."
