11		Governor who shall serve as voting members, specifically:[;]
12		1. Four (4) members who are farmers with experience in crop
13		production, each of whom shall be selected from a list of at least three
14		(3) individuals nominated by the Kentucky Corn Growers Association,
15		the Kentucky Small Grain Growers Association, the Kentucky
16		Soybean Association, or other similar trade organizations or
17		commodity groups;
18		2. Four (4) members who are farmers with experience in animal
19		agriculture, each of whom shall be selected from a list of at least three

21		the Kentucky Dairy Development Council, the Kentucky Pork
22		Producers Association, the Kentucky Poultry Federation, the
23		Kentucky Sheep and Goat Development Office, or other similar trade
24		organizations or commodity groups;
25		3. Three (3) members who shall be appointed from the state at large who
26		are farmers with due consideration to geographical distribution
27		throughout the state and industry representation:

2			individuals nominated by the AgriBusiness Association of Kentucky or
3			other similar trade organizations representing agribusiness; and
4			(5) One (1) member who shall be appointed from a list of at least three (3)

6		(d)	The state president of the Kentucky FFA Association [Future Farmers of
7			America] who shall serve as a nonvoting member for the duration of his or
8			<u>her term;</u>
9		(e)	The state president of the <u>Kentucky</u> Young Farmers <u>Association</u> [of America]
10			who shall serve as a nonvoting member for the duration of his or her term;
11			and
12		(f)	The state president of the <u>Kentucky</u> 4-H[Club] who shall serve as a nonvoting
13			member for the duration of his or her term.
14	(2)	<u>The</u>	members who serve on the board and were appointed by the Governor shall
15		serv	e four (4) year terms and shall serve until their successors are duly appointed
16		and	qualified. The initial appointments shall be for staggered terms, as follows:
17		<u>(a)</u>	Three (3) members shall be appointed for one (1) year;
18		<u>(b)</u>	Three (3) members shall be appointed for two (2) years;

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1	(4) The board shall be a body corporate under the corporate name "State Board of
2	Agriculture" and shall have the usual corporate powers.
3	→ Section 2. KRS 246.130 is amended to read as follows:
4	The board shall meet at least four (4) times per year to consider the general agricultural,
5	horticultural, and forestry interests of the state, and to take the necessary steps for
6	carrying out the purpose of the board. The Commissioner may, and at the request of eight
7	(8)[six (6)] of its voting members[shall], call its meetings and the board may adjourn any
8	meeting to a time and place as may be determined. Eight (8)[Six (6)] voting members
9	shall constitute a quorum. <u>Eight (8)</u> [Six (6)] members may call the board together for the
10	transaction of business if the Commissioner, upon their request, refuses to do so.

2	<u>(6)</u>	"Facility" means a single location with one (1) or more structures used for the
3		storage or handling of grain;
4	<u>(7)</u>	"Failure" means the occurrence of one (1) or more of the following events:
5		(a) A licensee's inability to pay for storage obligations in accordance with
6		requirements set forth in statute, administrative regulation, or contract;
7		(b) A public declaration of insolvency;
8		(c) A revocation of a grain dealer license or grain warehouse operator license
9		and an outstanding obligation or indebtedness by the licensee;
10		(d) A failure to pay a producer in the ordinary course of business and a bona
11		fide dispute does not exist between the licensee and the producer;
12		(e) A failure to deliver a grain to a depositor in the ordinary course of business
13		and a bona fide dispute does not exist between the licensee and the
14		<u>depositor;</u>
15		(f) A failure to make timely application for license renewal; or
16		(g) A denial of license renewal application;
17	<u>(8)</u>	"Forward pricing contract" means an agreement for sale which provides that:
18		(a) Title passes at the time of delivery; and
19		(b) The price will be determined at a later date;
20	<u>(9)</u>	"Fund" means the Kentucky grain insurance fund established by Section 21 of
21		this Act;
22	<u>(10)</u>	"Fund-covered grain" means grain as used in Section 13 of this Act;
23	<u>(11)</u>	"Grain" means corn, wheat, soybeans, rye, barley, oats, grain sorghums, or
24		popcorn;
25	<u>(12)</u>	"Grain dealer" means any person engaged in the business of buying grain from
26		producers for resale, milling, or processing. A producer of grain buying grain for
27		the producer's own use as seed or feed shall not be considered to be engaging in

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1	the business of buying grain for resale, milling, or processing;
2	(13) "Grain warehouse operator" means a person who owns, controls, operates, or
3	manages any public grain warehouse in which grain is stored for compensation;
4	(14) "Gross value" means the value of grain after deductions for quality discounts,
5	including but not limited to discounts for excessive moisture or foreign matter,
6	but before deductions for storage or marketing charges;
7	(15) "Person" means any individual, partnership, firm, corporation, limited liability
8	company, or other corporate entity created under the laws of the Commonwealth
9	or any other jurisdiction;
10	(16) "Producer" means the owner, tenant, or operator of land who has an economic
11	or financial interest in grain or receives all or any part of the proceeds from the
12	sale of grain;
13	(17) "Seed" means grain that is set aside to be used for the purpose of producing new
14	plants;
15	(18) "Warehouse" means any building, structure, or other protected enclosure,
16	permanent or temporary, used or useable for the storage or conditioning of grain.
17	Buildings used in connection with or operation of the grain warehouse shall be
18	deemed part of the warehouse; and
19	(19) "Warehouse receipt" means a document of title issued by a person engaged in
20	the business of storing grains for compensation.
21	→SECTION 4. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 251 IS CREATED TO

23	(1) The purpose of this chapter is to promote the welfare of the Commonwealth and
24	its people, and to provide economic stability for its agricultural and agribusiness

14	(1) Upon receiving grain, a licensee shall issue a scale ticket to the depositor.
15	(2) Upon request from a representative of the department, a licensee shall produce
16	for inspection and copying the scale tickets and any other documents that were
17	issued for received grain.
18	→SECTION 6. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 251 IS CREATED TO
19	READ AS FOLLOWS:
20	(1) Every scale ticket issued by a licensed grain dealer or a licensed grain warehouse
21	operator shall include the following information in writing:
22	(a) A statement indicating whether the delivery was inbound or outbound;
23	(b) The name of the depositor for inbound delivery or consignee for outbound
24	<u>delivery;</u>
25	(c) The date of delivery;
26	(d) The name and street address of the location where the grain was delivered;
27	(e) The quantity of the grain that was delivered, in bushels or pounds;

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1		(f) The kind and grade of grain delivered, unless its identity is preserved by
2		placing it in a special bin or a special pile which has a unique or identifying
3		mark that appears on the receipt;
4		(g) A statement whether the grain is being sold at a specified price or being
5		delivered pursuant to a forward pricing contract whose terms were pre-
6		approved by a representative of the department; and
7		(h) The scale ticket's serial number.
8	<u>(2)</u>	Grain received by a licensee shall be weighed on department-approved scales.
9		→SECTION 7. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 251 IS CREATED TO
10	REA	D AS FOLLOWS:
11	<u>(1)</u>	No person shall be or act as a grain dealer in the Commonwealth without holding
12		a valid grain dealer license issued by the department.
13	<u>(2)</u>	No person shall engage in the business of buying grain from producers for
14		resale, milling, or processing in the Commonwealth without holding a valid grain
15		dealer license issued by the department; provided, however, that no license shall
16		be required in order to buy grain from sellers who are not producers of grain.
17	<u>(3)</u>	No person shall be or act as a grain warehouse operator in the Commonwealth
18		without holding a valid grain warehouse operator license issued by the
19		department.
20	<u>(4)</u>	No person shall own, control, operate, or manage any public warehouse in which
21		grain is stored for compensation in the Commonwealth without holding a valid
22		grain warehouse operator license issued by the department.
23	<u>(5)</u>	Any person who possesses unpaid-grain for more than thirty (30) days shall be
24		deemed to be acting as a grain warehouse operator and shall be subject to the
25		licensing and financial requirements for grain warehouse operators under the
26		provisions of this chapter.
27	(6)	Licenses issued by the department shall be valid for a period of time not to exceed

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1	one (1) year and shall expire on June 30 each year.
2	(7) A separate license shall be required for each facility in the Commonwealth.
3	(8) The board, in conjunction with the department, shall promulgate administrative
4	regulations setting forth a schedule of fees for licensed grain warehous
5	operators. Any changes to the schedule of fees shall be approved by a majorit
6	vote of the board. The schedule of fees shall be reviewed by the board at least on
7	(1) time every four (4) years. The annual increase in board-approved license fee
8	shall be limited to five percent (5%) and shall not exceed twenty percent (20%
9	over any four (4) year period.
10	(9) The board, in conjunction with the department, shall promulgate administrative
11	regulations setting forth a schedule of fees for licensed grain dealers. An
12	changes to the schedule of fees shall be approved by a majority vote of the board
13	The schedule of fees shall be reviewed by the board at least one (1) time ever
14	four (4) years. The annual increase in board-approved license fees shall b
15	limited to five percent (5%) and shall not exceed twenty percent (20%) over an
16	four (4) year period.
17	(10) The department shall have the authority to suspend or revoke a license if the
18	board or department determines the licensee has violated a provision of thi
19	chapter or any administrative regulation promulgated under this chapter.
20	→SECTION 8. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 251 IS CREATED TO
21	READ AS FOLLOWS:
22	(1) Receipts collected from grain dealer or grain warehouse operator licensing fee
23	shall be used by the department to offset the cost of:
24	(a) The salary and benefits for employees in the department's Division of
25	Regulation and Inspection; and
26	(b) The vehicles, mileage, training, legal fees, accounting fees, and other
27	expenses incurred by the department of the board in connection with th

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1	provisions authorized by this chapter.
2	(2) Receipts collected from grain dealer or grain warehouse operator licensing fees
3	shall not be deposited in, or used to pay expenses incurred in connection with, the
4	administration of the Kentucky grain insurance fund.
5	→ SECTION 9. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 251 IS CREATED TO
6	READ AS FOLLOWS:
7	(1) The department shall not issue or renew a grain dealer or grain warehouse
8	operator license under this chapter until the applicant or licensee has filed with
9	the department satisfactory evidence of financial responsibility.
10	(2) Evidence of financial responsibility shall:
11	(a) Consist of:
12	1. A surety bond, executed by the applicant as principal, and issued by a
13	corporate surety authorized to conduct business in this state;
14	2. A certificate of deposit issued by a federally insured financial
15	institution in this state;
16	3. An irrevocable letter of credit issued by a federally insured financial
17	institution in this state;
18	4. Other security, as deemed acceptable by the department; or
19	5. Any combination of subparagraphs 1. to 4. of this paragraph, so long
20	as the aggregate value of the evidence meets the requirements of this
21	section;
22	(b) Be made payable to the board;
23	(c) Be in an amount meeting the requirements of this section;
24	(d) In the case of a bond, be conditioned upon the faithful performance of:
25	1. All obligations of a licensee under the terms of this chapter and any
26	administrative regulations promulgated under it, from the effective
27	date of the bond until the license is revoked, denied, or suspended or

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1		the bond is canceled, whichever comes first; and
2		2. Any obligations the applicant or licensee may contract for with
3		producers, depositors, or other persons placing grains in the
4		applicant's or licensee's facilities, from the effective date of the bond
5		and thereafter, regardless of whether or not the applicant's or

20	<u>li</u>	icensed by the department.

23	(5) N	No person may release, cancel, or discharge security filed with the department

27	f	or grain, or if the department determines that the licensee does not have a

4	constitute grounds for suspension or revocation of a license.

9	1. That was paid by the dealer for grain purchased in the dealer's most

13	the grain dealer's most recently completed fiscal year do not exist or
14	are not available; and
15	(b) For a licensed grain warehouse operator, the aggregate dollar value of:
16	1. The grain deposited in the grain warehouse operator's most recently
17	completed fiscal year; or
18	2. The grain the department estimates will be deposited in the operator's
19	warehouse during the current fiscal year, if records for the warehouse
20	operator's most recently completed fiscal year do not exist or are not
21	<u>available.</u>
22	(8) In no event shall the required security for a licensee be less than fifty thousand
23	dollars (\$50,000) nor more than one million dollars (\$1,000,000).
24	→SECTION 10. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 251 IS CREATED TO
25	READ AS FOLLOWS:
26	(1) A licensee using paper scale tickets, settlement sheets, or purchase contracts shall
27	comply with the following requirements:

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1		(a) Documents shall be pre-numbered sequentially; and
2		(b) Settlement sheet information shall be cross-referenced with scale tickets.
3	<u>(2)</u>	A licensee using electronic scale tickets, settlement sheets, purchase contracts, or
4		other documents shall conform to the formats and procedures required by the
5		<u>department.</u>
6	<u>(3)</u>	A licensee shall provide, and make available to the department or the board, a
7		complete and accurate set of business records, including:
8		(a) Records of all transactions, including records and accounts of all grains
9		received and withdrawn or delivered;
10		(b) Records, filed in numerical order, of all scale tickets, warehouse receipts,
11		and settlement sheets that have been issued, voiced, or lost; and
12		(c) Copies of contracts for the sale or storage of grain.
13	<u>(4)</u>	A licensee shall retain its business records for a minimum of four (4) years.
14	<u>(5)</u>	A licensed grain warehouse operator shall retain copies, either digitally or on
15		paper, of warehouse receipts or other documents evidencing ownership of any
16		grain, or any liability of the grain warehouse operator, so long as such
17		documents evidence a valid ownership interest or debt. A licensee shall retain
18		copies of such documents for a period of not less than four (4) years from the
19		date when the ownership interest or debt was extinguished.
20	<u>(6)</u>	A licensee's accounting functions shall be performed in conformity with
21		generally accepted accounting principles.
22	<u>(7)</u>	A licensee's business records shall accurately identify any liens or encumbrances
23		on grain that is held or owned by the licensee.
24	<u>(8)</u>	A licensee shall provide to the department at least once annually, and upon
25		request, an audited financial statement that is certified by the licensee, its owner,
26		or other officer to be an accurate reflection of the licensee's financial condition,
27		except when exempted by subsection (5) of Section 19 of this Act.

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(9) The board, in conjunction with the department, shall have authority to

1

2		promulgate administrative regulations setting forth additional recordkeeping
3		requirements for licensees.
4		→SECTION 11. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 251 IS CREATED TO
5	REA	D AS FOLLOWS:
6	<u>(1)</u>	No licensee shall enter into forward pricing contracts without first attaining
7		approval from the department to enter into these contracts. A licensee entering
8		into forward pricing contracts shall keep any records and ledgers the department
9		deems necessary to document the licensee's obligations.
10	<u>(2)</u>	A licensee that has entered into a forward pricing contract shall make a copy
11		available for inspection by the department or the board upon request.
12	<u>(3)</u>	Forward pricing contracts shall be in writing.
13	<u>(4)</u>	The board, in conjunction with the department, shall promulgate administrative
14		regulations setting forth the minimum information that shall be included in any
15		forward pricing contract entered into by a licensee.
16	<u>(5)</u>	By the tenth day of each month, any licensee that has entered into a forward
17		pricing contract shall submit to the department a report accurately reflecting its
18		position on the last day of the previous month.
19	<u>(6)</u>	A licensee which has entered into one (1) or more forward pricing contracts shall
20		maintain at least eighty percent (80%) of the value of the licensee's unpaid
21		obligations for all grain purchased under forward pricing contracts, using one
22		(1) or more of the following:
23		(a) Grain maintained in storage in the licensee's warehouse or other storage
24		facilities;
25		(b) Rights to grain as evidenced by a warehouse receipt or scale ticket for
26		storage of the grain under an agreement with another warehouse approved
27		by a representative of the department; or

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1		(c) Proceeds from the sale of grain as evidenced by one (1) or more of the
2		following:
3		1. Funds held in a separate account, designated for the benefit of unpaid
4		sellers of grain that was delivered under forward pricing contracts, in
5		a state or federally licensed financial institution or a lending agency of
6		the Farm Credit Administration;
7		2. Short-term investments held in time accounts, designated for the
8		benefit of unpaid sellers of grain that was delivered under forward
9		pricing contracts, in a state or federally licensed financial institution
10		or a lending agency of the Farm Credit Administration; or
11		3. Other evidence of unencumbered security or assets acceptable to the
12		department, including but not limited to an irrevocable letter of credit
13		or surety bond.
14	<u>(7)</u>	If the department or the board determines that a licensee does not have sufficient
15		net worth to satisfy the indebtedness, the department shall prohibit the transfer or
16		disbursement of any grain, property, or assets except for the satisfaction of
17		unpaid obligations for grain that was delivered under forward pricing contracts.
18		Disbursements of payments to sellers shall be made on a pro rata basis of the
19		value of the remaining grain.
20		→ SECTION 12. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 251 IS CREATED TO
21	REA	AD AS FOLLOWS:
22	<u>(1)</u>	The department shall inspect each licensed grain warehouse at least two (2) times
23		each year. The department's inspection shall include:
24		(a) A determination whether the grain in storage is properly accounted for;
25		(b) An assessment of the storage facilities for fitness; and
26		(c) An assessment of the condition of the grain in storage.
27	(2)	The department shall permit a licensee to store grain at another facility that is
