1	AN ACT relating to farmer-focused mental health services and making an
2	appropriation therefor.
3	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
4	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 248 IS CREATED TO
5	READ AS FOLLOWS:
6	(1) (a) The Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy shall create and administer a
7	program related to farmer-focused mental health services.
8	(b) The purpose of the program is to provide:
9	1. Access to information on issues impacting mental health;
10	2. A telephonic and Internet-based message function to leave comments
11	or questions and receive responses; and
12	3. Assistance with paying for up to three (3) mental health guidance
13	sessions with a mental health professional licensed or certified in
14	Kentucky whose scope of practice includes providing mental health
15	treatment services;
16	for the farming community in the Commonwealth.
17	(2) The Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy shall report to the Interim Joint
18	Committee on Appropriations and Revenue and the Interim Joint Committee on
19	Agriculture annually, within sixty (60) days following the close of each fiscal
20	year, the activities undertaken, the results of those activities, and funds expended
21	for each activity during that fiscal year related to the farmer-focused mental
22	health services program.
23	→ Section 2. KRS 304.17B-003 is amended to read as follows:
24	(1) There is hereby established the Kentucky Health Care Improvement Authority as an
25	agency, instrumentality, and political subdivision of the Commonwealth and a
26	public body corporate and politic with all the powers, duties, and responsibilities
27	conferred upon it by statute and necessary or convenient to carry out its functions.

1	The authority shall be administered by a board of fifteen (15) members and is
2	created to perform the public functions of administering programs financed by the
3	funds appropriated to the authority in conformance with KRS 304.17B-001 to
4	304.17B-031 and any terms and conditions established by the General Assembly as
5	a part of the act appropriating the funds. The members of the board shall consist of
6	the following:
7	(a) The commissioner of the Department of Insurance, or the commissioner's
8	designated representative, who shall serve as chair;
9	(b) The secretary of the Cabinet for Health and Family Services, or the secretary's
10	designated representative, who shall serve as vice chair;
11	(c) Two (2) nonvoting members serving ex officio from the House of

(c) Two (2) nonvoting members serving ex officio from the House of Representatives, one (1) of whom shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House and one (1) appointed by the minority floor leader, and who shall serve a term of two (2) years;

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- (d) Two (2) nonvoting members serving ex officio from the Senate, one (1) of whom shall be appointed by the President of the Senate and one (1) appointed by the minority floor leader, and who shall serve a term of two (2) years;
- (e) The deans of the University of Louisville School of Medicine and the University of Kentucky College of Medicine, or their designated representatives;
- 21 (f) The commissioner of the Department for Public Health, or the commissioner's designated representative;
- 23 (g) Two (2) representatives of Kentucky health care providers, who shall be 24 appointed by the Governor; and
- 25 (h) Four (4) citizens at large of the Commonwealth, who shall be appointed by the Governor.
- 27 (2) The terms of office of the initial appointments of the citizen at-large members of the

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board shall expire one (1), two (2), three (3), and four (4) years respectively from
the expiration date of the initial appointment. One (1) of the initial terms of the
representatives of health care providers, at least one (1) of whom shall be male and
at least one (1) of whom shall be female, shall be for two (2) years and one (1) shall
be for four (4) years. All succeeding appointments shall be for four (4) years from
the expiration date of the term of the initial appointment. Two (2) of the citizens at
large shall be male and two (2) shall be female. Board members shall serve until
their successors are appointed.

- (3) In making private sector and citizen-at-large appointments to the board, the Governor shall assure broad geographical and ethnic representation as well as representation from consumers and the major sectors of Kentucky's health care and health insurance businesses. Private sector and citizen-at-large members shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses.
- (4) The authority shall establish procedures for accountability, including the review of expenditures, and develop mechanisms to measure the success of programs that receive allocated funds in accordance with any criteria or instructions provided by the General Assembly. The authority shall be attached to the Department of Insurance for administrative purposes and shall establish advisory boards it deems appropriate, which shall consist of health insurance consumers, health care providers, and insurance company representatives, to assist with oversight of fund expenditures.
- 23 (5) Grants and funds obtained under KRS 304.17B-001 to 304.17B-031 shall be used 24 for expenditures as follows:
- 25 (a) <u>Beginning on July 1, 2020, and each fiscal year thereafter, an amount of</u>
 26 <u>five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) shall be appropriated for the</u>
 27 farmer-focused mental health services program created in Section 1 of this

All remaining funds shall be allocated as follows:

<u>1.</u> Seventy percent (70%)[of all moneys in the fund] shall be placed into the Kentucky Access fund for the purpose of funding Kentucky Access;

2.[(b)] Twenty percent (20%)[of all moneys in the fund] shall be spent on a collaborative partnership between the University of Louisville and the University of Kentucky dedicated to lung cancer research; and

<u>3.</u>[(c)] Ten percent (10%)[of all moneys in the fund] shall be used to discourage the use of harmful substances by minors.

The authority shall assure that a public hearing is held on the expenditure of funds allocated under this section, except for funds allocated to the Kentucky Access fund or to the farmer-focused mental health services program created under Section 1 of this Act. Advertisement of the public hearing shall be published at least once but may be published two (2) more times, if one (1) publication occurs not less than seven (7) days nor more than twenty-one (21) days before the scheduled date of the public hearing. The authority shall submit an annual report to the Governor and the General Assembly indicating how the funds were used and an evaluation of the program's effectiveness in health care and access to health insurance for Kentucky residents.

Neither the authority nor its employees shall be liable for any obligations of any of the programs established under KRS 304.17B-001 to 304.17B-031. No member or employee of the authority shall be liable, and no cause of action of any nature may arise against them, for any act or omission related to the performance of their powers and duties under KRS 304.17B-001 to 304.17B-031, unless the act or omission constitutes willful or wanton misconduct. The authority may provide in its policies and procedures for indemnification of, and legal representation for, its members and employees.

- 5 (9) The authority shall meet at least quarterly and at other times upon call of the chair or a majority of the authority.
- 7 Section 3. KRS 164.476 is amended to read as follows:
- The "Lung Cancer Research Fund" is created and shall receive funds each year from the Kentucky health care improvement fund in the amount specified in KRS 304.17B-003(5)(b)2. The lung cancer research fund shall be used to finance the Lung Cancer Research Project described in subsection (5) of this section. No revenues from the lung cancer research fund shall be allocated until the board has
- adopted the strategic plan described in subsections (5) and (6) of this section.
- 14 (2) A research consortium between the University of Kentucky and the University of
- Louisville is created and shall be known as the Governance Board of the Lung
- 16 Cancer Research Project. The consortium shall be attached to the Council on
- 17 Postsecondary Education for administrative purposes.
- 18 (3) The board shall consist of nine (9) members appointed by the Governor as follows:
- 19 (a) Two (2) members shall be from the faculty of the School of Medicine at the University of Kentucky;
- 21 (b) Two (2) members shall be from the faculty of the School of Medicine at the University of Louisville;
- 23 (c) Two (2) members shall be from the Council on Postsecondary Education; and
- 24 (d) Three (3) members shall be from the state at large, one (1) of whom shall be appointed chair by the Governor.
- 26 (4) Except as provided in paragraphs (a) to (d) of this subsection, the terms of the 27 members shall be for four (4) years and until their successors are appointed and

16		(b)	Establish a statewide clinical trial network to make university-based clinical
17			trials available to the community physician in order to bring the most
18			innovative cancer treatments to all Kentuckians in need of these treatments;
19		(c)	Leverage the resources earmarked for the Lung Cancer Research Project
20			toward the certification of the cancer program at the University of Kentucky
21			and the University of Louisville by the National Cancer Institute as a cancer
22			center; and
23		(d)	Undertake other initiatives consistent with the strategic plan.
24	(6)	The	strategic plan shall identify both short-term and long-term goals and the
25		appr	copriate oversights to measure progress toward achievement of those goals; it
26		shal	l be updated every two (2) years.

The Governance Board of the Lung Cancer Research Project shall submit an annual

1	report to the Governor and the Legislative Research Commission by September 1
2	each year for the preceding fiscal year, outlining its activities and expenditures.

The Auditor of Public Accounts, on an annual basis, shall conduct a thorough review of all expenditures from the lung cancer research fund and, if necessary in the opinion of the Auditor, the operations of the Lung Cancer Research Project and the lung cancer research fund.
