| 14 | (d) ''Primary prevention programming'' means institutional action and         |
| 15 | strategies intended to prevent sexual violence before it occurs;              |
| 16 | (e) "Sexual violence" means physical sexual acts attempted or perpetrated     |
| 17 | against a person's will or when a person is incapable of giving consent,      |
| 18 | including rape, sexual assault, sexual battery, sexual abuse, and sexual      |
| 19 | <u>coercion;</u>  |
| 20 | (f) "Survivor" means a student who has experienced sexual violence, domestic  |
| 21 | violence, dating violence, or stalking while enrolled at a postsecondary      |
| 22 | education institution;  |
| 23 | (g) "Survivor-centered" means a systemic focus on the needs and concerns of a |
| 24 | survivor of sexual violence, domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking; |

| 26 | (h) ''Trauma-informed response'' means a response involving an                |
| 27 | understanding of the complexities of sexual violence, domestic violence,      |

| 5  | (2) On or before July 1, 2020, all postsecondary education institutions shall adopt a |
| 6  | <u>comprehensive policy concerning sexual violence, domestic violence, dating</u>     |
| 7  | violence, and stalking consistent with federal and state law. The postsecondary       |
| 8  | education institution's comprehensive policy shall include but not be limited to      |
| 9  | the following components:   |
| 10 | (a) A definition of consent that includes but is not limited to:                      |
| 11 | <b>1.</b> Consent is a freely given agreement to sexual activity;                     |
| 12 | 2. A person's lack of verbal or physical resistance or submission                     |
| 13 | resulting from the use or threat of force does not constitute consent;                |
| 14 | 3. A person's manner of dress does not constitute consent;                            |
| 15 | 4. A person's consent to past sexual activity does not constitute consent             |
| 16 | to future sexual activity;  |
| 17 | 5. A person's consent to engage in sexual activity with one (1) person                |
| 18 | does not constitute consent to engage in sexual activity with another;                |
| 19 | 6. A person can withdraw consent at any time; and                                     |
| 20 | 7. A person cannot consent to sexual activity if he or she is unable to               |
| 21 | understand the nature of the activity or give knowing consent due to                  |
| 22 | circumstances including but not limited to the person being:                          |
| 23 | a. Incapacitated due to the use or influence of alcohol or drugs;                     |
| 24 | b. Asleep or unconscious;   |
| 25 | <u>c. Under age; or</u>   |
| 26 | d. Incapacitated due to a mental disability;  |
| 27 | (b) Procedures that students of the postsecondary education institution may           |

| 7  | (d) The postsecondary education institution's complaint resolution procedures     |
| 8  | if a student alleges violation of the comprehensive policy;                       |
| 9  | (e) The sanctions that the postsecondary education institution may impose         |
| 10 | following the implementation of its complaint resolution procedures in            |
| 11 | response to an alleged violation of the comprehensive policy;                     |
| 12 | (f) An amnesty provision that provides immunity to a student who reports, in      |
| 13 | good faith, an alleged violation by another individual of the postsecondary       |
| 14 | institution's comprehensive policy;   |
| 15 | (g) A prohibition against retaliation against those who, in good faith, report or |
| 16 | disclose an alleged violation of the comprehensive policy, file a complaint,      |
| 17 | or otherwise participate in the complaint resolution procedure and                |
| 18 | sanctions for individuals who engage in retaliatory conduct;                      |
| 19 | (h) The name, address, and telephone number of the nearest medical facility to    |
| 20 | each campus of the postsecondary education institution where a survivor           |
| 21 | may have a medical forensic examination completed; and                            |
| 22 | (i) The name, telephone number, address, and Web site, if available, of           |
| 23 | community-based, state, and national sexual assault crisis centers.               |
| 24 | (3) On or before July 1, 2020, a postsecondary education institution shall        |
| 25 | prominently publish, timely update, and have easily available on its Web site all |
| 26 | of the following information:   |
| 27 | (a) The postsecondary education institution's comprehensive policy;               |

| 20 |            | (b) The referral or provision of services to a survivor; or                        |
| 21 |            | (c) Any campus complaint resolution procedure that results from an alleged         |
