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1	AN ACT relating to services for persons with severe mental illness.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 205 IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) As used in this section, unless the context otherwise requires:
6	(a) "Severe mental illness" means someone over eighteen (18) years of age
7	having, within the past year, a diagnosable mental, behavioral, or emotional
8	disorder that causes serious functional impairment that substantially
9	interferes with or limits one (1) or more major life activity;
10	(b) "Supported employment" means employment which matches individuals
11	with severe mental illness to jobs best suited for them and provides
12	continuous support during employment; and
13	(c) "Supportive housing" means integrated, community-based housing that
14	provides people with all rights of tenancy under state and local landlord and
15	tenant laws and is linked to voluntary and flexible supports and services
16	designed to meet individual needs and preferences.
17	(2) The Cabinet for Health and Family Services shall submit to the federal agency
18	that approves waivers, waiver amendments, and plan amendments an application
19	for a waiver or waiver amendment or request a plan amendment designed to
20	provide supportive housing and supported employment services to the severely
21	mentally ill.
22	(3) Supportive housing shall include but not be limited to:
23	(a) Pretenancy assistance in viewing and selecting units, obtaining necessary
24	documents to complete housing and voucher applications, seeking
25	reasonable accommodation when needed, and entering into lease
26	agreements;
27	(b) Assistance with apartment setup and moving in, identifying transportation

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1		resources and routes, and orientation to the neighborhood;
2		(c) Tenancy skills support such as bill payment, housekeeping, lease
3		observance, and getting along with neighbors;
4		(d) Tenancy preservation and maintenance including assistance in obtaining
5		entitlement benefits, building social connections, accessing primary and
6		other health care, and support for voluntary compliance with treatments;
7		(e) Assistance in crisis planning and eviction prevention.
8	<u>(4)</u>	The cabinet shall include in its waiver, waiver amendment, or request for a plan
9		amendment a residential option for people with severe mental illness to live until
10		they are able to get stabilized on medication.
11	<u>(5)</u>	The cabinet shall provide an update biennially on the status of the application for
12		a waiver or waiver amendment or request for a plan amendment to the Interim
13		Joint Committee on Health and Welfare and Family Services.
