A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging the Kentucky Congressional Delegation
 and Donald Trump, President of the United States, to enact measures to ensure a level
 playing field for foreign and domestic hardwood producers and manufacturers.

WHEREAS, hardwood lumber manufacturing is a vital component to Kentucky's
economic growth and represents a substantial contribution across the state in the area of
employment through new job creation, innovation, and capital investment; and

WHEREAS, Kentucky's forest products industries account for an economic impact
of greater than \$14 billion and employ more than 60,000 people in the primary industries
such as loggers and sawmills and in producers of finished products such as mouldings,
millworks, bourbon barrels, cabinetry, flooring, and paper products; and

WHEREAS, the forest products industry in the United States accounts for four
percent of the gross domestic product for total manufacturing, employs nearly 900,000
people, and produces \$210 billion in products annually; and

WHEREAS, increasing hardwood lumber manufacturing will improve job creation and capital investment in Kentucky while simultaneously stimulating the economy and improving the supply chain for wood products for consumers across the United States; and

WHEREAS, the raw materials consumed by hardwood producers in Kentucky have
been processed responsibly for generations by producers being held accountable through
forest management and sustainable manufacturing practices; and

WHEREAS, the supply of raw materials is now in jeopardy due to exportation of raw hardwood timber to foreign consumers, notably China, where the demand for American hardwood logs continues to rise exponentially; and

WHEREAS, government subsidization of Chinese companies in the form of tax concessions artificially increases the value of raw hardwood timber products from the United States and counterbalances the fair market price; and

innovative manufacturing practices, the industry is experiencing a potentially catastrophic
 decline due to the supply of raw timber being sold overseas before domestic
 manufacturing can finish the product; and

WHEREAS, after years of unsustainable forest management practices, the Chinese
government has undertaken a robust national reforestation program while cracking down
on illegal forest clearing; and

WHEREAS, Russia and France have taken action to prevent exportation of logs by
imposing stringent tariff schedules and in some cases prohibiting log exports; and

9 WHEREAS, the United States hardwood industry needs tariff protection as well as 10 action from federal, state, and local authorities to halt unfair practices that hinder the 11 industry;

12 NOW, THEREFORE,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Senate concurring therein:

Section 1. The Kentucky Congressional Delegation and President Donald
 Trump should take all necessary action to defend the hardwood industry from unfair and
 illegal practices by foreign exporters of raw hardwood timber and specifically Chinese
 exports of raw hardwoods.

Section 2. The Kentucky and United States hardwood lumber industry requests
that measures be enacted to ensure a level playing field for all market entrants both
foreign and domestic so that the quality wood products and economic growth are
maintained.
