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1	A RESOLUTION urging Congress to enact legislation granting the United States
2	Department of Agriculture jurisdiction over labeling requirements for imitation meat
3	products.
4	WHEREAS, Kentucky produces more head of beef cattle than any other state east
5	of the Mississippi River; and
6	WHEREAS, poultry is the largest revenue-generating agricultural commodity in
7	Kentucky; and
8	WHEREAS, Kentucky farmers continue to expand their production capabilities
9	with regard to poultry, beef cattle, and other livestock; and
10	WHEREAS, in recent years various business entities have worked to engineer food
11	products resembling beef, pork, chicken, and other meat products that are familiar to
12	consumers, but do not include meat harvested from real animals. These products are
13	commonly known as imitation meat, cell-cultured meat, cultured meat, or fake meat; and
14	WHEREAS, considerable concern exists that American consumers could be harmed
15	by food safety deficiencies in imitation meat products, and cell-based meat products are
16	not currently subject to stringent food safety regulations; and
17	WHEREAS, considerable concern exists that imitation meat products use product
18	descriptions and labeling that suggest or imply that imitation meat products contain actual
19	harvested meat from farmer-raised livestock or poultry, which may prevent consumers
20	from making fully-informed decisions when purchasing food; and
21	WHEREAS, many Kentucky farmers believe that new imitation meat products
22	entering the market should be clearly marked with prominently-placed labels and
23	indications that inform consumers that they are purchasing products that do not contain
24	actual harvested meat from farmer-raised livestock or poultry; and
25	WHEREAS, for decades Congress has assigned jurisdiction over food product
26	labeling requirements for meat and poultry products to the United States Department of
27	Agriculture (USDA); and

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WHEREAS, Kentucky farmers and consumers have greater confidence in the USDA's ability to oversee the development and implementation of food safety standards and food product labeling standards for imitation meat products than in the abilities of other federal agencies to undertake these responsibilities;

- 5 NOW, THEREFORE,
- 6 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
- 7 Commonwealth of Kentucky:

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- Section 1. The House of Representatives urges the United States Congress to
 enact legislation mandating that the USDA exercise jurisdiction over food product safety
 and food product labeling requirements for imitation meat products.
 - → Section 2. The House of Representatives urges the USDA to promulgate administrative regulations requiring imitation meat product manufacturers to adopt labeling and marketing terminology that is fully distinct from those traditional terms connoting real meat products, so that consumers can readily distinguish real meat products from imitation meat products or plant-based alternatives.
 - →Section 3. The House of Representatives urges the USDA to implement requirements for cultured meat products that are blended or otherwise combined with traditionally-produced meat to be clearly and prominently labeled as such, and these labels should include the percentage of actual harvested meat from farmer-raised livestock or poultry in such products.
 - → Section 4. The House of Representatives urges the USDA to ensure that any cell-cultured meat products derived from livestock or poultry undergo comprehensive pre-market risk assessments before being sold or offered for sale in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
- Section 5. The House of Representatives urges the USDA to be as stringent as possible in combating consumer misperceptions that could impede the continued prosperity of livestock and poultry producers in Kentucky and across the nation, or create

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- 1 new risks to public health, safety, and welfare.
- 2 → Section 6. The Clerk of the House of Representatives shall send a copy of this
- 3 Resolution and notification of its adoption to the Speaker and Minority Leader of the
- 4 United States House of Representatives, the Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the
- 5 United States Senate, the Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture, and to
- 6 each member of Kentucky's delegation to the United States Congress.
