1	A RESOLUTION recognizing January 11, 2019, as National Milk Day.
2	WHEREAS, Kentucky has a rich history of dairy farming, and the tradition
3	continues to this day with roughly 600 dairy farms that house approximately 56,000 milk
4	cows across the Commonwealth; and
5	WHEREAS, milk is an important commodity to Kentucky's economy as the
6	Commonwealth's dairy farmers produce approximately 121 million gallons of milk each
7	year with a value of nearly \$200 million; and
8	WHEREAS, dairy farming is largely a family tradition, as ninety-eight percent
9	(98%) of dairy farms in the United States are family-owned and operated; and
10	WHEREAS, the quinquennial Dietary Guidelines for Americans report published
11	by the United States Department of Agriculture and Department for Health and Human
12	Services recommends consuming three servings of dairy, including milk, each day as part
13	of a balanced diet; and
14	WHEREAS, milk provides three of the four key nutrients that are typically lacking
15	in the average American's diet: calcium, potassium, and vitamin D; and
16	WHEREAS, milk's unique combination of nutrients plays a key role in preventing
17	heart disease, obesity, high blood pressure, diabetes, osteoporosis, and a number of other
18	health ailments; and
19	WHEREAS, milk is particularly important for the development of strong bones and
20	teeth in children and young adults; and
21	WHEREAS, milk is named and designated as the official state drink of Kentucky;
22	NOW, THEREFORE,
23	Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
24	Commonwealth of Kentucky:
25	→Section 1. The House of Representatives does hereby recognize January 11,
26	2019, as "National Milk Day" and celebrates the abundance of safe, healthy, high-quality,
27	and delicious milk thanks to the hard work and commitment of dairy farmers throughout
