1 A RESOLUTION urging the Public Service Commission to consider all costs 2 related to the importation of coal for electricity generation.

- WHEREAS, the amount of coal produced in Kentucky has decreased from 109,018,240 tons in 2011 to 39,587,320 tons in 2018; and
- 5 WHEREAS, revenue from the sale of Kentucky coal is reinvested by the Kentucky
- 6 coal industry in local economies creating multiplier effects of other direct and indirect
- 7 benefits; and
- 8 WHEREAS, in 2017, the largest contributor to real gross domestic product growth
- 9 in Kentucky was mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction, which accounted for 0.65
- percent of the total growth in real gross domestic product; and
- WHEREAS, in 2018, annual coal employment declined to 6,409; and
- WHEREAS, differences in severance tax policies of other states have impacted the
- 13 competitiveness of Kentucky coal; and
- 14 WHEREAS, approximately 54 percent of coal consumed in Kentucky by electric-
- 15 generating units was imported from Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, Pennsylvania, West Virginia,
- and Wyoming;
- 17 NOW, THEREFORE,
- 18 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
- 19 Commonwealth of Kentucky:
- 20 → Section 1. The Kentucky House of Representatives urges the Public Service
- 21 Commission to amend its administrative regulations to consider all costs, including fossil
- 22 fuel-related economic impacts within Kentucky, when analyzing coal purchases under the
- 23 fuel adjustment clause.
