- WHEREAS, today, there are more than 59 million Girl Scout alumnae in the United
- 16 States, and there are 1.7 million girl members and 750,000 adult volunteers; and

- congratulates the organization upon its 107th anniversary, and thanks those Girl Scouts in
- 19 the Commonwealth for all they have done to shape the lives of Kentucky's young girls;
