A RESOLUTION declaring the second Saturday in May each year as Cornelia de

- 2 Lange Syndrome Awareness Day in the Commonwealth.
- WHEREAS, Cornelia de Lange Syndrome (CdLS) is a very rare genetic disorder
- 4 that is apparent at birth; and
- 5 WHEREAS, CdLS is characterized by growth delays, distinctive facial features,
- 6 malformations of the hands, feet, arms, or legs, other physical abnormalities, intellectual
- 7 disabilities, and developmental delays; and
- 8 WHEREAS, CdLS occurs in approximately one in every 10,000 live births in the
- 9 United States; and
- WHEREAS, more than 400 cases have been reported in medical literature,
- including affected individuals within several related families;
- 12 NOW, THEREFORE,
- 13 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
- 14 Commonwealth of Kentucky:
- Section 1. The House of Representatives hereby declares the second Saturday in →
- 16 May each year as Cornelia de Lange Syndrome Awareness Day in the Commonwealth.
- → Section 2. The House of Representatives finds that it is in the interest of the
- 18 Commonwealth to increase public awareness of Cornelia de Lange Syndrome, a very rare
- 19 genetic disorder. Early intervention is important in ensuring that children with CdLS
- 20 reach their highest potential. Services that may be beneficial include special remedial
- 21 education, vocational training, speech therapy, and other medical and social services.
- 22 Genetic counseling is recommended for affected individuals and their families and other
- 23 treatment is symptomatic and supportive.
