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1 A RESOLUTION declaring the first full week in May each year as Tardive

- 2 Dyskinesia Awareness Week in the Commonwealth.
- 3 WHEREAS, Tardive Dyskinesia (TD) is a condition of involuntary muscle
- 4 movements of the face, trunk, and extremities that can vary in frequency and amplitude;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, TD is a condition that may occur with certain medications used to treat
- 7 mental illness. TD results from treatment with dopamine receptor blocking agents used
- 8 for both psychiatric and nonpsychiatric conditions, and can persist even after
- 9 discontinuing treatment; and
- WHEREAS, research done by The Citizens Commission on Human Rights shows
- that more than 12 million Americans take antipsychotics and that more than 500,000 of
- those patients may have TD; and
- WHEREAS, anyone taking an antipsychotic medication may develop TD, but
- people who are elderly, female, diabetic, or have a mental illness are at a greater risk of
- developing TD;
- 16 NOW, THEREFORE,
- 17 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
- 18 Commonwealth of Kentucky:
- → Section 1. The House of Representatives hereby declares the first full week of
- 20 May each year as Tardive Dyskinesia Awareness Week in the Commonwealth.
- → Section 2. The House of Representatives believes that it is in the interest of the
- 22 Commonwealth to increase public awareness of Tardive Dyskinesia, a neurological
- 23 disorder that is characterized by repetitive, involuntary muscle movements and may occur
- as a side effect of long-term use of antipsychotic and other medications.
