12		station facilities, as well as above-ground pipelines and related facilities;
13		6. Railroad yards and railroad tunnel portals;
14		7. A drinking water collection, treatment, or storage facility;
15		8. Grounds or property of a state prison, juvenile justice facility, jail, or
16		other facility for the detention of persons charged with or convicted of
17		<u>crimes;</u>
18		9. A facility used for research, development, design, production, delivery,
19		or maintenance of military weapons systems, subsystems, and
20		components or parts to meet military requirements of the United States;

22		<u>10.[9.]</u> A wireless communications facility, including the tower, antennae,
23		support structures and all associated ground-based equipment, and a
24		telecommunications central switching office; and
25	(b)	"Unmanned aircraft system" means an aircraft that is operated without the
26		possibility of direct human interaction from within or on the aircraft and
27		includes everything that is on board or otherwise attached to the aircraft and

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1			all associated elements, including communication links and the components
2			that control the small unmanned aircraft, that are required for the safe and
3			efficient operation of the unmanned aircraft in the national airspace system.
4	(2)	(a)	A person commits the offense of trespass upon key infrastructure assets if he
5			or she knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in or upon real property on
6			which key infrastructure assets are located.
7		(b)	A person commits the offense of trespass upon key infrastructure assets if he
8			or she knowingly uses, or retains or authorizes a person to use, an unmanned
9			aircraft system to fly above real property on which key infrastructure assets
10			are located with the intent to cause harm or damage to or conduct surveillance
11			of the key infrastructure asset without the prior consent of the owner, tenant,
12			or lessee of the real property.
13	(3)	Tres	pass upon key infrastructure assets is a Class B misdemeanor for the first
14		offe	nse, and a Class A misdemeanor for a second or subsequent offense.
15	(4)	This	section does not apply to:
16		(a)	An unmanned aircraft system used by the federal government or by the

4		(d)	Operation of an unmanned aircraft system by a person or entity for a

8		(f)	An unmanned aircraft system used by an insurance company or a person
9			acting on behalf of an insurance company for purposes of underwriting an
10			insurance risk or investigating damage to insured property; or
11		(g)	An unmanned aircraft system used strictly in accordance with an order of a
12			court of competent jurisdiction.

18	(2)	"Cus	stody" means restraint by a public servant pursuant to a lawful arrest, detention,
19		or ar	n order of court for law enforcement purposes, but does not include supervision
20		of pr	robation or parole or constraint incidental to release on bail;
21	(3)	"Dar	ngerous contraband" means contraband which is capable of use to endanger the
22		safet	y or security of a detention facility or persons therein, including, but not limited

24		subs	tances; [,] any quantity of an alcoholic beverage; [, and] any quantity of

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1	(4)	"Detention facility" means any building and its premises used for the confinement	
2		of a person:	
3		(a) Charged with or convicted of an offense;	
4		(b) Alleged or found to be delinquent;	
5		(c) Held for extradition or as a material witness; or	
6		(d) Otherwise confined pursuant to an order of court for law enforcement	
7		purposes;	
8	(5)	"Escape" means departure from custody or the detention facility in which a person	
9		is held or detained when the departure is unpermitted, or failure to return to custody	
10		or detention following a temporary leave granted for a specific purpose or for a	
11		limited period; and	
12	(6)	As used in this section and KRS 520.015, "penitentiary" includes any facility	
13		operated by the Department of Corrections and the confines of any work detail or	
14		other detail, whether under guard or not, under the custody and control of the	

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Department of Corrections.
