- 3 → Section 1. KRS 317A.010 is amended to read as follows:
- 4 As used in this chapter, unless the context requires otherwise:
- 5 (1) "Beauty salon" means any establishment, *fixed or mobile*, in which the practice of
- 6 cosmetology is conducted for the general public or for consideration;
- 7 (2) "Board" means the Kentucky Board of Cosmetology;
- 8 (3) (a) "Blow drying services" means beautifying, cleaning, or arranging the hair of
- 9 an individual for consideration only at a limited beauty salon.
- 10 (b) "Blow drying services" include any of the following services performed on an
- individual's hair:
- 12 1. Arranging;
- 13 2. Cleaning;
- 14 3. Curling;
- 15 4. Dressing;
- 5. Blow drying; and
- 17 6. Performing any other similar procedure.
- 18 (c) "Blow drying services" do not include any service:
- 1. Popularly known as a Brazilian blowout;
- 20 2. That includes color services or that includes cutting, lightening, or
- 21 chemically treating hair; or
- 22 3. That otherwise falls under the practice of cosmetology, except as
- 23 authorized in paragraph (b) of this subsection;
- 24 (4) "Cosmetologist" means a person who engages in the practice of cosmetology for the
- 25 public generally or for consideration, regardless of the name under which the
- 26 practice is conducted;
- 27 (5) "Cosmetology" means the practice upon the human neck and head of cutting hair,

15		cosi	netolo	gy, esthetic practices, and nail technology;
16	(7)	"Est	heticia	an" means a person who is licensed by the board to engage in esthetic
17		prac	tices in	n the Commonwealth of Kentucky;
18	(8)	(a)	"Estl	netic practices" means one (1) or more of the following acts:
19			1.	Giving facials, including consultation and skin analysis;
20			2.	Giving skin care;
21			3.	Removing facial hair;
22			4.	Beautifying or cleaning the body with the use of cosmetic preparations,
23				antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams; or

Treatment of an illness or a disease;

4	(9)	"Esthetic practices school" or "school of esthetic practices" means any operation
5		place, or establishment in or through which persons are trained in esthetic practices;
6	(10)	"Esthetic salon" means a place, fixed or mobile, where an esthetician performs
7		esthetic practices;
8	(11)	"Eyelash artistry" means the process of attaching semipermanent lashes or eyelash
9		extensions to natural eyelashes;
10	(12)	"Limited beauty salon" means any establishment in which the practice of blow
11		drying services only is conducted for the general public or for consideration;
12	(13)	(a) "Makeup artistry" means applying cosmetic products to the face and body.
13		(b) "Makeup artistry" includes:
14		1. Corrective and camouflage techniques; and
15		2. Airbrushing.
16		(c) "Makeup artistry" does not include:
17		1. Face painting at carnivals or fairs; or
18		2. Application of cosmetics when not done for consideration;
19	(14)	"Nail salon" means any establishment, fixed or mobile, in which the practice of nai
20		technology only is conducted for the general public or for consideration;
21	(15)	"Nail technician" means a person who practices nail technology for the general
22		public or for consideration;
23	(16)	"Nail technology" means the practice of cutting, trimming, polishing, coloring
24		cleansing, applying artificial nails, or massaging, cleaning, treating, or beautifying
25		the hands and feet of any human, for which a license is required by this chapter:

(17) "Nail technology school" or "school of nail technology" means any operation, place,

or establishment in or through which persons are trained in nail technology;

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1	(18) (a)	"Natural hair braiding" means a service of twisting, wrapping, weaving,
2		extending, locking, or braiding hair by hand or with mechanical devices.
3		Natural hair braiding is commonly known as "African-style hair braiding" but
4		is not limited to any particular cultural, ethnic, racial, or religious forms of
5		hair styles.
6	(b)	"Natural hair braiding" includes:
7		1. The use of natural or synthetic hair extensions, natural or synthetic hair
8		and fibers, decorative beads, and other hair accessories;
9		2. Minor trimming of natural hair or hair extensions incidental to twisting,
10		wrapping, weaving, extending, locking, or braiding hair;
11		3. The use of topical agents such as conditioners, gels, moisturizers, oils,
12		pomades, and shampoos; and
13		4. The making of wigs from natural hair, natural fibers, synthetic fibers,
14		and hair extensions.
15	(c)	"Natural hair braiding" does not include:
16		1. The application of dyes, reactive chemicals, or other preparation to alter
17		the color of the hair or to straighten, curl, or alter the structure of the
18		hair; or
19		2. The use of chemical hair joining agents such as synthetic tape, keratin
20		bonds, or fusion bonds.
21	(d)	For the purposes of this subsection, "mechanical devices" means clips, combs,
22		curlers, curling irons, hairpins, rollers, scissors, needles, thread, and hair
23		binders; and
24	(19) "Th	reading" means the process of removing hair from below the eyebrow by use of
25	a th	read woven through the hair to be removed.

The board shall promulgate administrative regulations including but not limited to

1	adm	inistrative regulations that:
2	(a)	Protect the health and safety of the public;
3	(b)	Protect the public against incompetent or unethical practice
4		misrepresentation, deceit, or fraud in the practice or teaching of beauty
5		culture;
6	(c)	Set standards for the operation of the schools and salons;
7	(d)	Protect the students under this chapter;
8	(e)	Set standards for the location and housing of beauty salons or cosmetology
9		schools in the state. This subsection does not apply to the instructional
10		programs in cosmetology in the state area vocational and technical schools;
11	(f)	Set standards for the quantity and quality of equipment, supplies, materials
12		records, and furnishings required in beauty salons, esthetic salons, nail salons
13		and cosmetology, esthetic practices, and nail technology schools;
14	(g)	Establish the qualifications of instructors of cosmetology, instructors of
15		esthetic practices, instructors of nail technology, and apprentice teachers;
16	(h)	Establish requirements for the hours and courses of instruction at cosmetology
17		schools and esthetic practices schools and nail technology schools;
18	(i)	Establish requirements for the examinations of applicants for licenses;
19	(j)	Establish the requirements for the proper education and training of students;
20	(k)	Address the course and conduct of school owners, instructors, apprentice
21		instructors, licensed cosmetologists, estheticians, nail technicians, beauty
22		salons, esthetic salons, nail salons, cosmetology schools, schools of esthetic
23		practices, and schools of nail technology; [ and]
24	(1)	Establish a code of ethics for persons licensed by the board: and
25	<u>(m)</u>	Establish provisions for scheduling inspections of mobile salons, along with

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2		→ Section 3. KRS 317A.155 is amended to read as follows:
3	(1)	As used in this section, "funeral establishment" means funeral establishment as
4		defined in KRS 316.010.
5	(2)	Every person practicing as a cosmetologist, esthetician, or nail technician, with the
6		exception of a nail technician or cosmetologist exclusively practicing manicuring in
7		a licensed barber shop, shall practice in an establishment licensed by the board.
8	(3)	Notwithstanding subsection (2) of this section, persons holding an active license
9		from the board as a cosmetologist, esthetician, or nail technician and who practice
10		in salons licensed by the board shall be permitted to render services outside and
11		establishment licensed by the board for pay, free, or otherwise, to:
12		(a) A person suffering from a terminal illness and who is receiving the services of
13		a hospice program either at home or at a hospice inpatient unit; [or]
14		(b) A person who is deceased and in the care of a funeral establishment; or
15		(c) A person suffering from a medical condition, as attested by a physician in
16		writing, which limits physical mobility to such an extent that it would
17		impose an undue burden on that person to attempt to travel to an
18		establishment licensed by the board.
19	(4)	Cosmetologists, estheticians, and nail technicians who render services authorized in
20		subsection (3) of this section shall have the permission of the owner or
21		administrator of the establishment where the services are rendered.
