Any records, 6 7 files, and documents associated with the activities of the Kentucky Tobacco Settlement 8 Trust Corporation shall be transferred to the Department of Agriculture. Any records, 9 files, documents, equipment, staff, supporting budgets, and any and all unexpended funds 10 associated with the activities of the Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy shall be 11 transferred to the Department of Agriculture.
