

1 A JOINT RESOLUTION designating the Jed Deters Memorial Highway in Kenton
2 County.

3 WHEREAS, Jed Deters was a graduate of Simon Kenton High School, Thomas
4 More College, and the Chase College of Law; and

5 WHEREAS, Jed Deters was an attorney at Deters Law Firm as well as City
6 Attorney for the City of Independence; and

7 WHEREAS, Jed Deters was a volunteer for Housing Opportunities of Northern
8 Kentucky and the Independence Fire Department. He was a member of the Kentucky
9 State Bar Association, a member and supporter of the National Rifle Association, former
10 chair of the Real Estate Appraisers Board, and served on the board of directors of Farmers
11 National Bank; and

12 WHEREAS, Jed Deters was a member of St. Cecilia Church in Independence; and

13 WHEREAS, Jed Deters departed this earthly life on March 2, 2015, leaving his
14 family, friends, and all those whose lives he had touched with his sense of humor and his
15 indelible kindness in solemn mourning; and

16 WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper that the life of Jed Deters and his service to the
17 city of Independence be memorialized in a tangible manner;

18 NOW, THEREFORE,

19 ***Be it resolved by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:***

20 ➔Section 1. The Transportation Cabinet shall designate Kentucky Route 17X, the
21 Independence Bypass, in Kenton County as the "Jed Deters Memorial Highway" and
22 shall, within 30 days of the effective date of this Resolution, erect appropriate signs
23 denoting this designation.
