2	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth is the birthplace of bourbon, a unique and
3	distinctive type of whiskey named after Bourbon County, Kentucky; and
4	WHEREAS, in 1964, Congress designated bourbon as America's native spirit; and
5	WHEREAS, Bardstown, Kentucky already hosts the Kentucky Bourbon Festival
6	that attracts over 50,000 people from the Kentucky Bluegrass Region, other states, and
7	countries; and
8	WHEREAS, Bardstown has one of the highest concentrations of bourbon
9	distilleries among all Kentucky counties and is featured prominently on the Kentucky
10	Bourbon Trail; and
11	WHEREAS, Bardstown has been recognized as the "Bourbon Capital of the
12	World"; and
13	WHEREAS, one-third of the world's bourbon is stored in Bardstown; and
14	WHEREAS, National Bourbon Day is already a recognized holiday in Kentucky on
15	June 14;
16	NOW, THEREFORE,
17	Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of
18	Kentucky:
19	Section 1. The Kentucky Senate respectfully urges the President and Congress
20	of the United States to recognize June 14 as National Bourbon Day.
21	Section 2. The Kentucky Senate respectfully urges the President and Congress
22	of the United States to designate Bardstown, Kentucky as the host city of National
23	Bourbon Day.
24	→Section 3. The Senate does hearby recognize National Bourbon Day in
25	Kentucky to be celebrated on June 14 every year as set forth in Governor Bevin's
26	proclamation on June 6, 2018.
