1	A RESOLUTION designating May 1, 2019, as Vaping Awareness Day.
2	WHEREAS, in 2018, 27.1 percent of high school students and 7.2 percent of
3	middle school students in the United States used a tobacco product; and
4	WHEREAS, one in five high school students and one in 20 middle school students
5	used e-cigarettes in 2018, high school use jumped 78 percent, and middle school use
6	jumped 48 percent in the United States over 2017; and
7	WHEREAS, in 2017, 26 percent of Kentucky high school students, compared to
8	19.5 percent nationwide, and 7.6 percent of Kentucky middle school students used a
9	tobacco product; and
10	WHEREAS, in 2017, 14.1 percent of Kentucky high school students, compared to
11	13.2 percent nationwide, and 3.9 percent of Kentucky middle school students used e-
12	cigarettes; and
13	WHEREAS, nicotine is a highly addictive drug that impairs brain development,
14	reducing impulse control and inhibiting learning; and
15	WHEREAS, nearly 90 percent of adult tobacco use starts before age 18; and
16	WHEREAS, three out of four teen smokers end up smoking into adulthood; and
17	WHEREAS, every day in the United States, 300 youth become daily cigarette
18	smokers; and
19	WHEREAS, youth who use e-cigarettes are more likely to become adult smokers;
20	and
21	WHEREAS, new tobacco products, such as JUUL and other pod mod e-cigarettes,
22	present an opportunity to update school health policies; and
23	WHEREAS, Kentucky has the fourth-highest youth smoking rate in the nation; and
24	WHEREAS, 2,500 new youths become smokers every year in Kentucky, and
25	119,000 youths alive today will die prematurely from smoking;
26	NOW, THEREFORE,
27	Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of

2 → Section 1. The members of the Senate hereby proclaim Wednesday, May 1,
3 2019, as Vaping Awareness Day in the Commonwealth.

4 → Section 2. The members of the Senate hereby urge all school districts to
5 organize and sponsor educational activities to educate students, staff, and parents about
6 the dangers of vaping and to train school staff to identify the warning signs of abuse and
7 how to assist students who suffer from or are at risk of addiction.
