

1 A RESOLUTION honoring the 107th anniversary of the Girl Scouts on March 12,
2 2019.

3 WHEREAS, on March 12, 1912, Juliette Gordon Low founded the first Girl Scout
4 troop in Savannah, Georgia, with just 18 girls; and

5 WHEREAS, in the 107 years since, the Girls Scouts have honored her vision and
6 legacy, building girls of courage, confidence, and character who make the world a better
7 place; and

8 WHEREAS, Girl Scouts consistently drive positive change in their communities;
9 and

10 WHEREAS, Girl Scout participation has been instrumental in the development of
11 female leaders in government, business, education, the arts, and public service; and

12 WHEREAS, while the Girl Scout program has evolved over the years, the
13 fundamental experience of being a part of Girl Scouts connects generations of women;
14 and

15 WHEREAS, today, there are more than 59 million Girl Scout alumnae in the United
16 States, and there are 1.7 million girl members and 750,000 adult volunteers; and

17 WHEREAS, this body rightfully acknowledges the work of the Girl Scouts,
18 congratulates the organization upon its 107th anniversary, and thanks those Girl Scouts in
19 the Commonwealth for all they have done to shape the lives of Kentucky's young girls;

20 NOW, THEREFORE,

21 ***Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of***
22 ***Kentucky:***

23 ➔Section 1. The members of the Senate hereby honor the Girl Scouts upon their
24 107th anniversary on March 12, 2019.
