cherishing those who were up all night and needed somebody to talk to; and
WHEREAS, Jack Reno was a phenomenal artist and musician, recording seven
albums over the course of his career and scoring 12 hits on the American Country Music
Top 100 chart, including "Hitchin' a Ride," "Repeat After Me," and "I Want One"; and
WHEREAS, Jack Reno passed away in 2008 in Florence, where his wife and family
still remain;
