1 AN ACT relating to assistance dogs. 2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky: 3 → Section 1. KRS 258.500 is amended to read as follows: 4 (1)As used in subsections (1) to (12) ((11)) of this section, "person" means a "person" with a disability" as defined by KRS 210.770. "Person" also includes a trainer of an 5 6 assistance dog. 7 As used in this section: (2)(a) "Assistance dog" means a dog that has been individual trained to do work 8 9 or perform tasks for a person with a disability; and 10 (b) "Assistance-dog-in-training" means a dog or puppy that has been selected 11 for assistance dog work and is being handled by a trainer of an assistance 12 dog. 13 If a person is accompanied by an assistance dog, neither the person nor the dog shall (3) 14 be denied admittance to any hotel, motel, restaurant, or eating establishment, nor 15 shall the person be denied full and equal accommodations, facilities, and privileges 16 of all public places of amusement, theater, or resort when accompanied by an 17 assistance dog. 18 Any person accompanied by an assistance dog shall be entitled to full and $(4)^{[(3)]}$ equal accommodations on all public transportation, if the dog does not occupy a 19 20 seat in any public conveyance, nor endanger the public safety. 21 <u>(5)</u>[(4)] No person shall be required to pay additional charges or fare for the 22 transportation of any accompanying assistance dog. 23 No person accompanied by an assistance dog shall be denied admittance and $(6)^{(5)}$ 24 use of any public building, nor denied the use of any elevator operated for public 25 use. <u>(7)[(6)]</u> Any person accompanied by an assistance dog may keep the dog in his

17	<u>(a)</u>	Expressly or impliedly represents that a dog in his or her possession is his
18		or her assistance dog or an assistance-dog-in-training for the purpose of
19		obtaining any rights or privileges afforded disabled persons accompanied by
20		assistance dogs, but unavailable to other people and their pets;
21	<u>(b)</u>	Knew or should have known that the dog in question did not meet the
22		definition of an assistance dog or assistance-dog-in-training; and
23	<u>(c)</u>	Takes a dog into a place of public accommodation where pets are not
24		permitted while the dogs is wearing a cape, vest, special leash, or other form
25		of identification that states or implies that the dog is an assistance dog
26		entitled to be present, even if the individual makes no affirmative
27		<u>statements.</u>

1 (15) Misrepresentation of a service dog is a violation.

2 (16) Any peace or animal control officer may investigate and enforce subsection (14) 3 of this section by making inquiry of the individual accompanied by the dog in question and issuing a citation. Refusal by the individual to answer the 4 permissible questions shall create a presumption that the dog is not an assistance 5 dog and the officer may issue the citation and require the individual to remove 6 7 the dog from the place of public accommodation. 8 → Section 2. KRS 258.991 is amended to read as follows: 9 Any person violating KRS 258.500[(2),] (3), (4), (5), (6), (7)[(11)],[-or] (12), or (13) shall 10 be punished by a fine of not less than two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250), nor more than 11 one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than ten 12 (10) nor more than thirty (30) days, or both. [No person shall be charged with a violation of KRS 258.500(2), (3), (4), (5), (6), (11), or (12) if the requirements of KRS 258.500(7) 13 14 are not met.]
