21	(3) The governing bodies of each of the following organizations shall nominate one
22	(1) person from each of the six (6) congressional districts of the Commonwealth,
23	as well as three (3) persons from the state at large, who meet the qualifications set
24	out in subsection (6) of this section, as candidates for appointment as members of
25	the board:
26	(a) The Kentucky Association of Counties;
2.7	(b) The Kentucky League of Cities: and

1		(c) The Kentucky Chamber of Commerce.
2	<u>(4)</u>	(a) The Governor shall select the original citizen members from the
3		aggregation of the lists provided pursuant to subsection (3) of this section,
4		with at least two (2) appointments being chosen from each organization's
5		<u>list.</u>
6		(b) Appointments to fill a vacancy shall be made from nominations tendered by
7		the organizations enumerated in subsection (3) of this section. Each
8		organization shall make one (1) nomination for each respective vacancy.
9		The nominees shall satisfy the geographic requirement of the particular
10		vacant position on the board.
11		(c) After initial appointments to the board expire, at least one (1) member of the
12		board shall be a nominee of each of the three (3) nominating entities
13		outlined under subsection (3) of this section.
14		(d) No more than five (5) of the nine (9) citizen members shall be of the same
15		political party.
16		(e) All appointments to the Kentucky Transportation Board shall be subject to
17		confirmation by the Senate in accordance with KRS 11.160.
18	<u>(5)</u>	Except for initial appointments, all appointments shall be for a term of four (4)
19		years. A voting member may be appointed for up to two (2) full consecutive terms.
20	<u>(6)</u>	In making appointments to the board, the Governor shall appoint citizen
21		members who have at least five (5) years' experience in the areas of
22		transportation, construction, finance, law, environmental issues, management, or
23		engineering. Members appointed to the board shall not have any interest in any
24		contract awarded by the Transportation Cabinet during their service, and for up
25		to two (2) years after their service ends.
26	<u>(7)</u>	Vacancies on the board which may occur from time to time shall be filled as
27		follows:

1	(a) Any vacancy which occurs shall be filled for the unexpired term in
2	accordance with the procedures established in subsections (3) and (4) of this
3	section.
4	(b) If any voting member misses more than two (2) consecutive meetings of the
5	board without showing good cause, then that position shall be declared
6	vacant by the board and filled in accordance with this section.
7	(c) If a member who has been appointed to represent a congressional district
8	changes residence to outside of that district, then that position shall be
9	declared vacant and filled in accordance with this section.
10	(8) The board shall elect a chair and a vice chair from its members.
11	(9) The board shall meet quarterly and at other times upon call of the chair or a
12	majority of the board.
13	(10) A quorum shall be a majority of the voting membership of the board.
14	(11) A quorum shall be required to organize and conduct all business of the board,
15	except that an affirmative vote of:
16	(a) Five (5) or more members of the board shall be required to approve the
17	recommended biennial highway construction plan and the recommended
18	six (6) year road plan; and
19	(b) Six (6) or more members of the board shall be required to terminate the
20	employment of the cabinet's secretary.
21	(12) Voting members shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for all
22	reasonable, necessary, and actual expenses.
23	(13) The Kentucky Transportation Board shall be attached to the Transportation
24	Cabinet's Office of the Secretary for administrative purposes.
25	(14) Notwithstanding KRS 12.028, the Kentucky Transportation Board shall not be
26	subject to reorganization by the Governor.
