1 AN ACT relating to voter registration.

2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

- 3 → Section 1. KRS 116.045 is amended to read as follows:
- 4 (1) Any person may register as a voter:
- 5 (a) During the period registration is open if he or she possesses, or will possess on
- 6 the day of the next regular election, the qualifications set forth in KRS
- 7 116.025<u>; *or*</u>
- 8 (b) By preregistration as provided in subsection (9) of this section.
- 9 (2) The county clerk shall cause all registration to be closed, *except for preregistration*
- 10 <u>under subsection (9) of this section</u>, the fourth Tuesday preceding through the first
- 11 Monday following any primary or <u>regular[general]</u> election, and the twenty-eight
- 12 (28) days prior to and seven (7) days following any special election. If the last day
- of registration falls on a state or federal holiday, the period runs until the end of the
- next day which is not a Saturday or Sunday <u>or</u>[nor] a state or federal holiday.
- During the period that registration is closed, the county clerk may accept and
- process registrations. Any voter who registers during the period that registration is
- 17 closed, except for any registered voter who transfers his or her registration pursuant
- to KRS 116.085(2) or (3), shall not be permitted to vote in the upcoming election.
- 19 (3) In all counties, the county clerk shall receive registrations, *including*
- 20 <u>preregistrations</u>, transfers, or changes of party affiliation, at branch offices at any
- 21 place in the county during those periods that the registration books are open except
- for those transfers pursuant to KRS 116.085(2) or 116.085(3). However, notice in
- 23 the manner provided by KRS Chapter 424 shall be given at least three (3), but not
- 24 more than fourteen (14), days in advance of the time and place of any branch
- registration, and ten (10) days' written notice shall be given to the county executive
- 26 committee of each major political party in the county in which the branch
- 27 registration is to be held.

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1	(4)	Any person may register to vote or may change his or her party affiliation in any of
2		the following ways:

- 3 (a) In person;
- 4 (b) By mail;

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- 5 (c) By means of the federal post card application, if the person is a resident of
 6 Kentucky and a member of the Armed Forces, or a dependent of members of
 7 the Armed Forces, or overseas citizen;
- 8 (d) By mail-in application form prescribed by the Federal Election Commission 9 pursuant to the National Voter Registration Act of 1993; or
 - (e) By other methods of registration, or reregistration, approved by the State Board of Elections, including the use of voluntary interested groups and political parties, under the proper supervision and directions of the county clerk, which may include door to door canvassing.
- 14 (5) Upon receipt of the form prescribed by the State Board of Elections or the Federal
 15 Election Commission pursuant to the National Voter Registration Act of 1993,
 16 properly filled out and signed by the applicant, the county clerk shall register the
 17 applicant.
- 18 (6) Any individual or group shall have access to a reasonable number of voter
 19 registration forms, including *preregistration forms*, *and* the mail-in application
 20 form prescribed by the Federal Election Commission pursuant to the National Voter
 21 Registration Act of 1993 in the county clerk's office. The individual or group shall
 22 act under the proper supervision and directions of the county clerk and shall return
 23 these completed forms to the county clerk for official registration by the county
 24 clerk.
- 25 (7) No later than December 31, 1994, the Transportation Cabinet shall equip all driver's 26 license agencies to comply with the provisions of the National Voter Registration 27 Act of 1993. The Secretary of State shall provide assistance and interpretation to the

13	<u>(9)</u>	A person who possesses the qualifications set forth in KRS 116.025 may								
14		preregister to vote on or after that person's sixteenth birthday and may vote in								
15		any election or primary occurring on or after that person's eighteenth birthday or								
16		as provided in Section 3 of this Act.

18	(1)	The county clerk shall provide voter registration forms and preregistration forms,								
19		not less than once during each school year, to each principal or assistant principal								
20		of every public high school, each area vocational school, and upon request, private								
21		schools.								
22	<u>(2)</u>	Each school[, who] shall designate a person[in each school] who shall be								
23		responsible for informing students and school personnel, not less than once during								
24		each school year, of the availability of the registration and preregistration forms								
25		and assist them in <u>proper registration or preregistration</u> [properly registering]. The

18	(1)	Befo	ore a person shall be qualified to vote in a primary, he or she:									
19		(a)	Shall possess all the qualifications required of voters in a regular election;									
20		(b)	Shall have been a registered member of the party in whose primary he or she									
21			seeks to vote on December 31 immediately preceding the primary; and									
22		(c)	Shall have remained continuously registered as a member of that party in									
23			whose primary he or she seeks to vote between December 31 immediately									
24			preceding the primary and the date set for the primary.

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- 2 (3) Any voter who withdraws his or her registration after December 31 immediately
- 3 preceding the primary, and reregisters as a voter with a different party affiliation,
- 4 during those periods that the registration books are open immediately preceding the
- 5 primary, shall not be eligible to vote in the upcoming primary.
- 6 (4) No person shall be allowed to vote <u>in a primary</u> for any party candidates or slates of
- 7 candidates other than that of the party of which he or she is a registered member.
 - (5) The qualifications shall be determined as of the date of the primary, without regard
- 9 to the qualifications or disqualifications as they may exist at the succeeding regular
- election, except that minors seventeen (17) years of age who will become eighteen
- 11 (18) years of age on or before the day of the regular election shall be entitled to vote
- in the primary if otherwise qualified. However, any registered voter, whether
- registered as a member of a party, political organization, political group, or as an
- independent, shall be qualified to vote in a primary for candidates listed in all
- 15 nonpartisan races.

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- (b) The voter registration <u>and preregistration</u> application portion of an application for a motor vehicle driver's license shall comply with the requirements of Section 5 of <u>Pub. L. No.</u>[Public Law] 103-31, the National Voter Registration Act of 1993.
- (4) Any change of address form submitted for purposes of a motor vehicle driver's license shall serve as notification of change of address for voter registration <u>or</u> <u>preregistration</u> for the registrant involved unless the registrant states on the form that the change of address is not for voter registration <u>or preregistration</u> purposes.
- 12 (5) (a) A completed voter registration <u>or preregistration</u> portion of an application for 13 a motor vehicle driver's license accepted by a circuit clerk shall be transmitted 14 to the county clerk of the county of the applicant's voting residence not later 15 than ten (10) days after the date of acceptance.
