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1	AN ACT relating to individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS 210.005 TO 210.366 IS CREATED
4	TO READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	The rights of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities include but
6	are not limited to the right to:
7	(1) Be treated at all times with courtesy and respect and with full recognition of their
8	dignity and individuality;
9	(2) Appropriate, safe, equal, and sanitary living, learning, and working
10	environments that comply with local, state, and federal standards and recognize
11	the individual's need for privacy and independence;
12	(3) Food adequate to meet accepted standards of nutrition;
13	(4) Practice the religion of their choice or to abstain from the practice of religion;
14	(5) Timely access to appropriate medical and dental treatment;
15	(6) Access ancillary services, including but not limited to occupational therapy,
16	physical therapy, speech therapy, and behavior supports and other psychological
17	<u>services;</u>
18	(7) Receive appropriate care and treatment in the least restrictive and intrusive
19	<u>manner;</u>
20	(8) Privacy, including but not limited to periods of privacy and places of privacy;
21	(9) Communicate freely with persons of their choice in any effective manner they
22	<u>choose;</u>
23	(10) Ownership and use of personal possessions to maintain individuality and
24	<u>personal dignity;</u>
25	(11) Social interaction and relationships with persons of their choosing;
26	(12) Access to opportunities that enable individuals to develop their full human
27	potential;

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- 1 (13) Pursue vocational opportunities that will promote and enhance economic
- 2 *independence*;
- 3 (14) Be treated equally as citizens under the law;
- 4 (15) Be free from emotional, psychological, verbal, and physical abuse;
- 5 (16) Participate in decisions that affect their lives and promote self-determination;
- 6 (17) Select an advocate to support their decision-making;
- 7 (18) Manage their personal financial affairs;
- 8 (19) Confidential treatment of all information in their personal and medical records,
- 9 <u>except to the extent that disclosure or release of records is permitted under KRS</u>
- 10 <u>210.235;</u>
- 11 (20) Voice grievances and recommend changes in policies and services without
- 12 *restraint, interference, coercion, discrimination, or reprisal;*
- 13 (21) Be free from excessive or unnecessary chemical or physical restraints;
- 14 (22) Freely participate in the political process;
- 15 (23) Communicate verbal or nonverbal refusal to participate in medical,
- 16 *psychological, or other research or experiments;*
- 17 (24) Participate in integrated programs of education, training, social development,
- 18 *habilitation, and recreation;*
- 19 (25) Fair and equal wages in integrated work places;
- 20 (26) Choose and maintain healthcare providers, personal care providers, services, and
  21 supports;
- (27) Accessible and timely transportation to enable equal opportunities to participate
  in their communities;
- 24 (28) Assistive technology to fully communicate and participate in their communities;

- 26 (29) Raise a family with adequate supports and without undue interference.
- $\Rightarrow$  Section 2. This Act may be cited as the Frank Huffman Act.
