1	AN ACT relating to the sponsorship of Transportation Cabinet facilities and
2	vehicles and making an appropriation therefor.
3	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
4	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 174 IS CREATED TO
5	READ AS FOLLOWS:
6	(1) As used in this section:
7	(a) ''Facility'' means any rest area or welcome center, and any roads, bridges,
8	or tunnels located within the state primary road system; and
9	(b) "Vehicle" means any device or contrivance for carrying or conveying
10	persons, property, or substances, including conveyance by highways or by
11	airway, which are owned or leased by the cabinet.
12	(2) The cabinet shall implement a program to facilitate commercial sponsorships of
13	facilities and vehicles. The cabinet shall work in conjunction with the
14	Transportation and Tourism Interagency Committee created in KRS 177.107 to
15	implement the program. Policies of the sponsorship program concerning areas
16	within the highway right-of-way must be submitted to and approved by the
17	Federal Highway Administration prior to implementation.
18	(3) Upon implementation of the program, the cabinet may enter into sponsorship
19	agreements with private entities in accordance with this section and
20	administrative regulations promulgated by the cabinet.
21	(4) A sponsorship agreement may allow a private entity to:
22	(a) Place signs and plaques identifying itself as a sponsor of a rest area,
23	welcome center, road, bridge, or tunnel; and
24	(b) Receive acknowledgement on in-vehicle transponders, service patrol
25	vehicles, maintenance vehicles, outreach and educational materials, and
26	Internet Web sites, as well as within telephone messages such as those of
27	<u>511 systems.</u>

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1	<u>(5)</u>	Sponsorship agreements:
2		(a) May include any provisions the cabinet deems necessary;
3		(b) Shall require the sponsor to pay fair market value for the extent of exposure
4		offered under the agreement; and
5		(c) Shall comply with Federal Highway Administration directives, and federal
6		rules and regulations.
7	<u>(6)</u>	All net revenue received by the cabinet from sponsorship agreements shall be
8		deposited to the maintenance account within the road fund and shall be
9		appropriated in accordance with federal and state laws regulating disbursement
10		of such funds.
11	<u>(7)</u>	The cabinet shall promulgate administrative regulations in accordance with KRS
12		Chapter 13A to carry out the program and shall consult with the Transportation
13		and Tourism Interagency Committee in developing those administrative
14		regulations.
