1	registered pursuant to KRS 309.080 to 309.089.
2	→SECTION 2. A NEW SECTION OF KRS 309.080 TO 309.089 IS CREATED
3	TO READ AS FOLLOWS:
4	(1) An applicant for certification as a certified alcohol and drug counselor assistant I
5	shall pay the board the initial fee for certification, and shall:
6	(a) Be at least eighteen (18) years of age;
7	(b) Have obtained a high school diploma or high school equivalency diploma;
8	(c) Have completed forty (40) classroom hours of board-approved curriculum,
9	twenty (20) hours of which shall have been obtained in the previous two (2)
10	years, that include the following chemical dependency specific content:
11	1. Theories of addiction;
12	2. Counseling procedures and strategies with addicted populations;
13	3. Group process and techniques working with addicted populations;
