2	Be it	enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3		→ Section 1. KRS 156.162 is amended to read as follows:
4	(1)	Pursuant to KRS 156.160, the Kentucky Board of Education shall promulgate
5		administrative regulations to establish the courses of study for the different grades.
6		The administrative regulation that sets forth the required and elective courses for the
7		schools shall include an elective social studies course on the various religious
8		texts of the many religions practiced in the Commonwealth:
9		(a) An elective social studies course on the Hebrew Scriptures, Old Testament of
10		the Bible;
11		(b) An elective social studies course on the New Testament of the Bible; or
12		(c) An elective social studies course on the Hebrew Scriptures and the New
13		Testament of the Bible].
14	(2)	The purpose of a course under this section is to:
15		(a) Teach students knowledge of <i>the religious texts' contents</i> [biblical content],
16		characters, poetry, and narratives that are prerequisites to understanding
17		contemporary society and culture, including literature, art, music, mores,
18		oratory, and public policy; and
19		(b) Familiarize students with, as applicable:
20		1. The contents of the <u>religious texts</u> [Hebrew Scriptures or New
21		Testament];
22		2. The <u>histories</u> [history] of the <u>religious texts</u> [Hebrew Scriptures or New
23		Testament];
24		3. The literary style and structure of the <u>religious texts</u> [Hebrew Scriptures
25		or New Testament]; and
26		4. The influence of the <u>religious texts</u> [Hebrew Scriptures or New

2	(3)	A student shall not be required to use a specific translation as the sole text of \underline{a}
3		religious text[the Hebrew Scriptures or New Testament] and may use as the basic
4		textbook a different translation[of the Hebrew Scriptures or New Testament] from
5		that chosen by the school council.
6	(4)	The Kentucky Department of Education shall include the course standards in the
7		program of studies for Kentucky schools, including the teacher qualifications and
8		required professional development.
9	(5)	A course offered under this section shall follow applicable law and all federal and
10		state guidelines in maintaining religious neutrality and accommodating the diverse
11		religious views, traditions, and perspectives of students in the school. A course
12		under this section shall not endorse, favor, or promote, or disfavor or show hostility
13		toward, any particular religion or nonreligious faith or religious perspective. The
14		Kentucky Board of Education, in complying with this section, shall not violate any
15		provision of the United States Constitution or federal law, the Kentucky
16		Constitution or any state law, or any administrative regulations of the United States
17		Department of Education or the Kentucky Department of Education.

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1	(5)	Any school council organized pursuant to KRS 160.345 or, if none exists, the
2		principal, may authorize the display of historic artifacts, monuments, symbols, and
3		texts, including but not limited to religious materials, in conjunction with a course
4		of study that includes an elective course in history, civilization, ethics, comparative
5		religion, literature, or other subject area that uses such artifacts, monuments,
6		symbols, and texts as instructional material if the display is:

- (a) Appropriate to the overall educational purpose of the course; and
