2	therefor.
3	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
4	→ SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS 199.892 TO 199.8996 IS CREATED
5	TO READ AS FOLLOWS:
6	(1) (a) Effective one (1) year after the effective date of this Act, licensed child-care
7	centers shall be tested for radon at least once every five (5) years by a
8	professional who is registered under and acting in compliance with KRS
9	<u>211.9109.</u>
10	(b) The cabinet shall encourage the use of radon measurement devices by
11	registered professionals which utilize new active or passive measurement
12	technologies that may become available, provided the devices meet the
13	minimum proficiency program standards set forth in KRS 211.9101 and
14	<u>211.9109.</u>
15	(2) Effective one (1) year after the effective date of this Act, as part of an initial
16	application or application for renewal as established by KRS 199.896, the cabinet
17	shall require proof that the facility has been tested for radon within the last five
18	(5) years, pursuant to the requirements of KRS 211.9109.
19	(3) (a) The report of the most current radon measurement shall be posted in the
20	child-care center and provided to parents or guardians of children attending
21	the child-care center in written format.
22	(b) The posting shall be:
23	1. In a manner that is easily readable;
24	2. In letters and numbers at least two (2) inches high; and
25	3. In a location accessible to the public.
26	(c) The cabinet shall promulgate an administrative regulation to specify
27	signage that shall accompany the measurement posting. At a minimum, the

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1		signage shall include the following information:
2		1. An explanation of the health risk associated with radon;
3		2. The levels of radon exposure at which corrective action is
4		recommended; and
5		3. Contact information for the state's radon program.
6		(d) The report to parents or guardians required by paragraph (a) of this
7		subsection shall also contain the information specified in paragraph (c) of
8		this subsection.
9		→ Section 2. KRS 211.9105 is amended to read as follows:
10	The	committee shall:
11	(1)	Advise the cabinet with the review, development, and maintenance of standard
12		operating procedures for radon measurement, radon mitigation, laboratory analysis,
13		and quality control;
14	(2)	Advise the cabinet with preparing an annual budget for the use of moneys received
15		by the cabinet from the collection of fees and fines, receipt of federal, state, and
16		<u>local</u> grants, and all other radon-related activities, <u>including financial assistance to</u>
17		child-care centers for radon testing and mitigation. Priority may be given for the
18		distribution of these funds to need-based applications for areas of the state that
19		are identified as child-care deserts by the cabinet and for child-care centers which
20		have a high proportion of Child Care Assistance Program participants;
21	(3)	Review and comment on relevant administrative regulations that are promulgated
22		pursuant to KRS 211.9101 to 211.9135 and make recommendations to and
23		otherwise advise the cabinet on these matters;
24	(4)	Record minutes of committee meetings and proceedings which shall be documented
25		and maintained for the committee by the cabinet in a public forum;
26	(5)	Make recommendations to the cabinet provided that the final determination rests
27		with the cabinet;

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1 (6) Hold the first meeting of the committee no later than October 1, 2011, to be

- 2 convened by the commissioner; and
- 3 (7) Perform any other duties and responsibilities relating to the topic of radon that may
- 4 be assigned by the cabinet.
- 5 → Section 3. KRS 211.9113 is amended to read as follows:
- 6 Each mitigation or measurement contractor or radon laboratory shall maintain an
- 7 insurance policy that:
- 8 (1) Is issued by an insurance company or other legal entity permitted to transact
- 9 insurance business in the Commonwealth of Kentucky;
- 10 (2) Provides for general liability coverage for measurement contractors in an amount of
- at least two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) that is maintained in effect at
- all times during the registration period;
- 13 (3) Provides for general liability coverage for mitigation contractors and radon
- laboratories in an amount of at least five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) that
- is maintained in effect at all times during the registration period;
- 16 (4) Lists the cabinet as a certificate holder of any insurance policy issued under
- subsection (1) of this section; and
- 18 (5) States that cancellation or nonrenewal of the underlying liability insurance policy is
- not effective until the cabinet receives at least ten (10) days' written notice of the
- 20 cancellation or nonrenewal.
- → Section 4. KRS 211.9125 is amended to read as follows:
- 22 (1) [Subject to an administrative hearing conducted in accordance with KRS Chapter
- 23 <del>13B, The cabinet may revoke, suspend, or restrict the registration of a registrant,</del>
- refuse to issue or renew registration, reprimand, censure, place on probation, or
- 25 impose a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500) per occurrence on a
- 26 certified person or business entity who:
- 27 (a) Has been convicted of a felony under the laws of the Commonwealth of any

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1			crime that involves theft or dishonesty, or is a sex crime as defined by KRS
2			17.500;
3		(b)	Has had disciplinary action taken against a professional license, certification,
4			registration, or permit held by the person or business entity seeking
5			registration;
6		(c)	Engaged in fraud or deceit in obtaining certification or registration;
7		(d)	Attempts to transfer the authority granted by the registration to another person
8			or business entity;
9		(e)	Disregards or violates the building codes, electrical codes, or related laws of
10			this Commonwealth or ordinances of any city, county, urban-county
11			government, consolidated local government, charter county government, or
12			unified local government;
13		(f)	Aids or abets any person attempting to evade the provisions of KRS 211.9101
14			to 211.9135 or the administrative regulations promulgated thereunder by the
15			cabinet;
16		(g)	Uses unfair or deceptive trade practices; or
17		(h)	Knowingly violates any of the provisions of KRS 211.9101 to 211.9135 or
18			any administrative regulation promulgated thereunder by the cabinet.
19	(2)	If ar	application for registration or renewal of registration is denied, the person or
20		busi	ness entity seeking registration shall not conduct radon measurement,
21		miti	gation, or laboratory analysis within the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
22	(3)	Noty	withstanding the existence or pursuit of any other civil or criminal remedy, the
23		cabi	net may institute proceedings in the Circuit Court of the county where the
24		pers	on resides or the business entity is located for an order enjoining the person or
25		busi	ness entity from engaging or attempting to engage in activities that violate any
26		prov	risions of KRS 211.9101 to 211.9135 or any administrative regulation
27		pron	nulgated thereunder by the cabinet.

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1	(4)	Any final order of the cabinet may be appealed through an administrative hearing
2		conducted [to the Circuit Court of the county in which the person resides or the
3		business entity is located after a written decision is rendered] in accordance with
4		KRS Chapter 13B.
5		→ Section 5. KRS 211.9131 is amended to read as follows:
6	(1)	Any certified person or business entity shall report to the cabinet the discovery of
7		any apparent noncompliance with any provision of KRS 211.9101 to 211.9135 or
8		any administrative regulation promulgated thereunder by the cabinet pertaining to
9		radon measurement, mitigation, or laboratory analysis.
10	(2)	Records required by this chapter or administrative regulations promulgated under
11		KRS 211.9101 to 211.9135, including but not limited to records of radon
12		measurement, mitigation, quality control program plans, calibration certifications,
13		laboratory analysis activities, worker health and safety plans, and equipment repairs
14		shall be retained by registrants, as applicable, for a minimum period of five (5)
15		years or the length of time of any warranty or guarantee, whichever is greater.
16		Records obtained by the cabinet are exempt from the disclosure requirements of
17		KRS 61.870 to 61.884, except that the cabinet shall make the records available
18		upon request:
19		(a) To the owner or occupant of a building; and
20		(b) To the public aggregated at the zip code level without identifying individual
21		homeowners or individual property locations.
22	(3)	Any measurement or mitigation contractor or radon laboratory applying for
23		registration or renewal of registration shall specify, for approval by the cabinet, the
24		location where records required under this section shall be maintained for
25		inspection by the cabinet. This location shall be within the Commonwealth of
26		Kentucky.

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→ Section 6. KRS 211.9133 is amended to read as follows:

1	(1)	There is created the radon mitigation and control fund as a separate trust and agency
2		fund in the State Treasury, to be administered by the cabinet. All fees, fines, grants,
3		state and federal moneys, and other moneys received by the cabinet pursuant to
4		KRS 211.9101 to 211.9135 shall be deposited in the fund and shall be used for the
5		implementation of KRS 211.9101 to 211.9135, and are hereby appropriated for
5		those purposes.

- Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, any moneys remaining in the fund at the close of the fiscal year shall not lapse but shall be carried forward to the next fiscal year.
- 9 (3) Any interest earnings of the fund shall become part of the fund and shall not lapse.

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
