2	Be it enac	ted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	<b>→</b> S	ection 1. KRS 405.075 is amended to read as follows:
4	(1) As u	ised in this section:
5	(a)	"Newborn infant" means an infant who is medically determined to be less than
6		thirty (30) days old; [ and]
7	(b)	"Newborn safety device" means a device:
8		1. Designed to permit a person to anonymously place a newborn infant
9		in the device with the intent to leave the newborn and for an
10		emergency medical services provider to remove the newborn from the
11		device and take custody of the newborn infant;
12		2. Installed with an adequate dual alarm system connected to the
13		physical location where the device is physically installed. The dual
14		alarm system shall be:
15		a. Tested at least one (1) time per week to ensure the alarm system
16		is in working order; and
17		b. Visually checked at least two (2) times per day to ensure the
18		alarm system is in working order;
19		3. Approved by, paid for by, and physically located inside a staffed police
20		station, staffed fire station, or staffed hospital that:
21		a. Is licensed or otherwise legally operating in this state; and
22		b. Is staffed continuously on a twenty-four (24) hour basis every
23		day by a licensed emergency medical services provider; and
24		4. Located in an area that is conspicuous and visible to police station,
25		fire station, or hospital staff; and
26	<u>(c)</u>	"Participating place of worship" means a recognized place of religious
27		worship that has voluntarily agreed to perform the duty granted in this section

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1			and display signage prominently on its premises regarding its participation in
2			this section and its operating hours during which staff will be present.
3	(2)	A p	arent shall have the right to remain anonymous, shall not be pursued, and
4		<u>shal</u>	I not be considered to have abandoned or endangered a newborn infant
5		und	er KRS Chapters 508 and 530 if the parent[who]:
6		<u>(a)</u>	Places a newborn infant:
7			<u>1.</u> With an emergency medical services provider:
8			2. [or] At a staffed police station, fire station, or hospital;
9			3. At a[, or] participating place of worship; or
10			4. Inside a newborn safety device, which is located inside a staffed police
11			station, staffed fire station, or staffed hospital and meets the
12			requirements of subsection (1) of this section; and
13		<u>(b)</u>	Expresses no intent to return for the <u>newborn</u> infant[ shall have the right to
14			remain anonymous and not be pursued and shall not be considered to have
15			abandoned or endangered the newborn infant under KRS Chapters 508 and
16			<del>530]</del> .
17	(3)	(a)	Any emergency medical services provider, police officer, or firefighter who
18			accepts physical custody of a newborn infant, or who physically retrieves a
19			newborn infant from a newborn safety device that meets the requirements
20			of subsection (1) of this section, in accordance with this section shall
21			immediately arrange for the infant to be taken to the nearest hospital
22			emergency room and shall have implied consent to any and all appropriate
23			medical treatment.
24		(b)	Any staff member at a participating place of worship who accepts physical
25			custody of a newborn infant in accordance with this section shall immediately
26			contact the 911 emergency telephone service as set forth in KRS 65.750 to
27			65.760, wireless enhanced 911 system as set forth in KRS 65.7621 to 65.7643,

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1		or emergency medical services as set forth in KRS Chapter 311A for
2		transportation to the nearest hospital emergency room.
3	(4)	By placing a newborn infant in the manner described in this section, the parent:
4		(a) Waives the right to notification required by subsequent court proceedings
5		conducted under KRS Chapter 620 until such time as a claim of parental
6		rights is made; and
7		(b) Waives legal standing to make a claim of action against any person who
8		accepts physical custody of the newborn infant.
9	(5)	A staffed police station, fire station, hospital, emergency medical facility, or
10		participating place of worship may post a sign easily seen by the public stating that
11		"This facility is a safe and legal place to surrender a newborn infant who is less than
12		30 days old. A parent who places a newborn infant at this facility and expresses no
13		intent to return for the infant shall have the right to remain anonymous and not be
14		pursued and shall not be considered to have abandoned or endangered their
15		newborn infant under KRS Chapters 508 and 530."
16	(6)	Actions taken by an emergency medical services provider, police officer, firefighter
17		or staff member at a participating place of worship in conformity with the duty
18		granted in this section shall be immune from criminal or civil liability. Nothing in
19		this subsection shall limit liability for negligence.
20	(7)	The provisions of subsection (2) of this section shall not apply when indicators of
21		child physical abuse or child neglect are present.

KRS 211.951, 216B.190, 405.075, 620.350, and 620.355 shall be known as "The

Representative Thomas J. Burch Safe Infants Act."

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
