- 14 (2) Criminal trespass in the second degree is a Class B misdemeanor *unless the person*
- 15 knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in a school building or upon school
- 16 premises as to which notice against trespass is given by fencing or other
- 17 enclosure in which case it is a Class A misdemeanor.
- → Section 3. KRS 511.080 is amended to read as follows:
- 19 (1) A person is guilty of criminal trespass in the third degree when he knowingly enters
- or remains unlawfully in or upon premises.
- 21 (2) Criminal trespass in the third degree is a violation unless the person knowingly
- 22 enters or remains unlawfully in or upon school premises in which case it is a
- 23 Class B misdemeanor.
- → Section 4. KRS 511.090 is amended to read as follows:
- 25 (1) A person "enters or remains unlawfully" in or upon premises when he is not
- 26 privileged or licensed to do so.
- 27 (2) A person who, regardless of his intent, enters or remains in or upon premises which

4	(3)	A license or privilege to enter or remain in or upon premises which are only partly
5		open to the public is not a license or privilege to enter or remain in or upon a part of
6		the premises which is not open to the public.
7	(4)	A person who enters or remains upon unimproved and apparently unused land
8		which is neither fenced nor otherwise enclosed does not commit criminal trespass
9		unless notice against trespass is personally communicated to him by the owner of
10		the land or some other authorized person or unless notice is given by posting in a
11		conspicuous manner.
12	(5)	Private land adjoining a railtrail that is neither fenced nor otherwise enclosed shall
13		be presumed to be land where notice against trespassing has been given by the
14		owner of the land, and a person utilizing the railtrail shall be presumed to lack
15		privilege or license to enter upon that land unless the person has permission from an
16		adjoining landowner to do so.
