1	AN ACT relating to a Veterans' Bill of Rights.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 40 IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) The Commonwealth of Kentucky hereby creates the Veterans' Bill of Rights in
6	order to:
7	(a) Increase veterans' access to jobs;
8	(b) Apply smart labor force data to direct veterans to in-demand fields;
9	(c) Increase veterans' access to college degrees, certificates, and licenses;
10	(d) Ensure state licensing boards recognize veterans' military training and
11	<u>experience;</u>
12	(e) Award college credit for related military experiences and training;
13	(f) Increase flexibility in course registration to reflect returning veterans'
14	needs; and
15	(g) Expand proven cost-effective training programs that leverage veterans'
16	<u>experiences.</u>
17	(2) (a) The Education and Workforce Development Cabinet is hereby directed to
18	produce monthly electronic reports of workforce need projections, by
19	industry, job type, geography, and needed credential, that include a
20	comparison of workforce needs with existing and projected workforce and
21	credential availability in Kentucky and highlight top in-demand industries,
22	job types, and credentials by geographic area.
23	(b) The Education and Workforce Development Cabinet shall include in the
24	reports a mapping of which in-demand job titles and credentials would
25	leverage skills, experience, and credentials possessed by veterans, and shall
26	forward the underlying data report and that additional information monthly
27	to appropriate military out-placement offices, education centers, nonprofit

1		programs working to connect veterans with jobs, and the Kentucky
2		Department of Veterans' Affairs.
3	<u>(3)</u>	The Department of Transportation is hereby directed to take all necessary steps to
4		annually increase the number of veterans taking advantage of the Federal Motor
5		Carrier Safety Administration's Military Skills Test Waiver Program, including
6		ensuring information on the program is accessible on the Department of
7		Transportation's homepage, coordinating with military placement and training
8		programs, including the Credentialing Opportunities Online program, and
9		disseminating information about the program to veterans with relevant
10		experience who are newly locating in Kentucky.
11	<u>(4)</u>	The Kentucky Board of Emergency Medical Services shall immediately review all
12		licensing practices and promulgate administrative regulations that are necessary
13		and appropriate to increase recognition of military training and experience
14		toward in-state licensing. The board shall report to the General Assembly within
15		three hundred sixty-five (365) days of the effective date of this Act any additional
16		steps that would require legislation and request that the General Assembly pass
17		that legislation.
18	(5)	The Kentucky Board of Medical Licensure shall immediately review all licensing
19		practices and promulgate administrative regulations that are necessary and
20		appropriate to increase recognition of military training and experience toward in-
21		state licensing. The board shall report to the General Assembly within three
22		hundred sixty-five (365) days of the effective date of this Act any additional steps
23		that would require legislation and request that the General Assembly pass that
24		legislation.
25	<u>(6)</u>	The Transportation Cabinet is hereby directed to review all state licenses for
26		which military members may have relevant training or experience and, within
27		three hundred sixty-five (365) days of the effective of this Act, produce a report

1		recommending steps that can be taken to increase recognition of military training
2		and experience toward in-state licensing. As soon as practicable, and no later
3		than three hundred sixty-five (365) days after issuance of the report, the
4		Transportation Cabinet shall take any steps identified in the report that can be
5		taken without further legislation, and shall report to the General Assembly
6		annually to request it enact any necessary legislation.
7	<u>(7)</u>	The Council on Postsecondary Education in Kentucky shall adopt procedures
8		necessary to fully implement this section and promulgate administrative
9		regulations requiring public postsecondary institutions to provide credit for
10		military training and experience based on policy established by the council.
11	<u>(8)</u>	Every veteran who enrolls as a student in good standing at a public
12		postsecondary institution shall, upon application, be granted academic credits
13		without limitation towards his or her degree for completion of courses that were
14		part of the veteran's military training or service if the completed courses meet the
15		standards of the American Council on Education or its equivalent for the
16		awarding of academic credits. No fee, tuition, or other charge shall be assessed
17		against a veteran who qualifies for such credit pursuant to this section.
18	<u>(9)</u>	Public postsecondary institutions shall:
19		(a) Allow early course registration to students who are veterans or members of
20		the United States Armed Forces, Reserves, or National Guard if the
21		institution offers an early course registration period for any segment of the
22		student population;
23		(b) Ensure a student who is called to active duty in the United States Armed
24		Forces, Reserves, or National Guard after having attended regularly for
25		thirteen (13) or more weeks or having completed eighty-five percent (85%)
26		of the term's work through acceleration shall be given full credit for each
27		course in which he or she has a grade of C or better;

1	(c) Allow students called to active duty who do not meet attendance
2	requirements sufficient to earn a grade to be entitled to a one hundred
3	percent (100%) refund of tuition and fees;
4	(d) Permit veterans with no previous college experience to file applications up
5	to the end of registration and be allowed to begin classes pending
6	completion of their application and provision of supporting documents; and
7	(e) Allow veterans returning from active duty to register even after normal
8	registration periods end, without late fees or other penalties.
9	(10) The Education and Workforce Development Cabinet shall annually review
10	apprentice, training, and other vocational programs focused on providing job
11	training and placement to returning military service members and veterans. The
12	annual review shall evaluate the costs and results of programs, recommend
13	programs for expansion with state funding, and include an estimate on future
14	returns to the state of improved outcomes from program expansion.
15	(11) The Education and Workforce Development Cabinet shall provide an annual
16	report to the General Assembly and to the Governor on January 1 of each year
17	for five (5) years after the effective date of this Act, to be used to inform annual
18	budget decisions.
